The Foster Campbell campaign issued a press release yesterday containing a number of claims that are clearly false. Whether Foster Campbell is intentionally misleading the public or is just sloppy with his research, his press release just proves what we already know to be true ... we can't trust Foster Campbell.

The Campbell campaign's [press release](#) is founded on a factual error that even a minimal amount of research would have uncovered. The Flint Group that is publicly disclosed as a donor to Prosperity with Accountability is a small consulting company, incorporated in Delaware and operated by Mike Flint. It does not now nor has it ever had any relationship with Koch Industries or Goldman Sachs. The rest of the claims in the press release that are based on this error are equally false.

The Campbell campaign's clumsy attempt to draw connections from two completely unrelated companies is likely intended to draw attention away from Foster Campbell's connections to the water company that supplied dirty, smelly, and dangerous water to the residents of Ouachita Parish, Louisiana. As a member of the Public Service Commission, Foster Campbell selected and approved this water company and then accepted thousands of dollars in campaign contributions from the owners of the company he voted for.

If we can't trust Foster Campbell with simple facts, we can't trust him to be our U.S. Senator.
