Grace & Peace
from the Pastor's Desk

"If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.'"

Romans 12:18-19

This month will be the 20th anniversary of 9/11, the day terrorists attacked the United States, a day that will never be forgotten. I think each one of us who lived then know exactly where we were and what we were doing when we heard the news. Almost 3000 people were killed and 6,000 more were injured. Why? Because 19 hijackers had political and religious beliefs that God wanted them to punish the United States for their alleged sins. These hijackers were not pure Muslims, their beliefs had been twisted beyond anything that could be called Islamic. They bought into lies.

The brutality of 9/11 shocked Americans, partly because they didn't realize that religious fanatics in other parts of the world can be so brutal. It makes us wonder how people can be drawn into such radical beliefs. We, as Christians, need to ask ourselves if there is anything in scriptures that we can do to reduce terrorism. And we need to honestly ask ourselves if we accept terrorism in justifiable circumstances.

The truth of Christianity is not a doctrine or dogma, rather, it is a person, Christ Jesus.

We have doctrine to guide us, to make sense of God's interaction with humanity and how we experience this interaction. These are subject to updates and changes.

Saul, who became Paul, is an example of this. He terrorized Christ followers with a message of anger and revenge. After his conversion experience on the road to Damascus, his writing changed. He confessed his zeal was a mistake and he guided persons to become Christ followers.

As Christians we believe that all people carry the image of God within them therefore everyone must be respected and loved. (That doesn't mean liked.) Remember the old Sunday school song, "Red and yellow, black, and white, they are precious in his sight. Jesus loves the little children of the world."? It's still true.

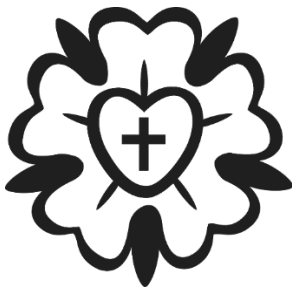

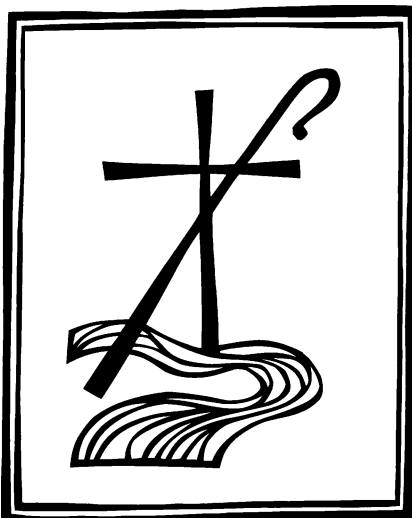

AHA FAMILY & FRIENDS CPR CLASS

Saturday, September 17, 9 am to noon

Fellowship Hall, Messiah Lutheran Church

Taught by AHA certified instructor Susan Majewski, this course includes adult hands-only CPR, adult CPR with breaths, child CPR with breaths, adult and child AED use, infant CPR, and mild and severe airway block for adults, children and infants. Cost is \$15/student, payable to the instructor, and includes a book and card verifying class participation. (It is not intended as BLS certification for health care providers.) This course is video-led and includes skills practice on a training manikin. There is room in the fellowship hall for social distancing, masks are optional. 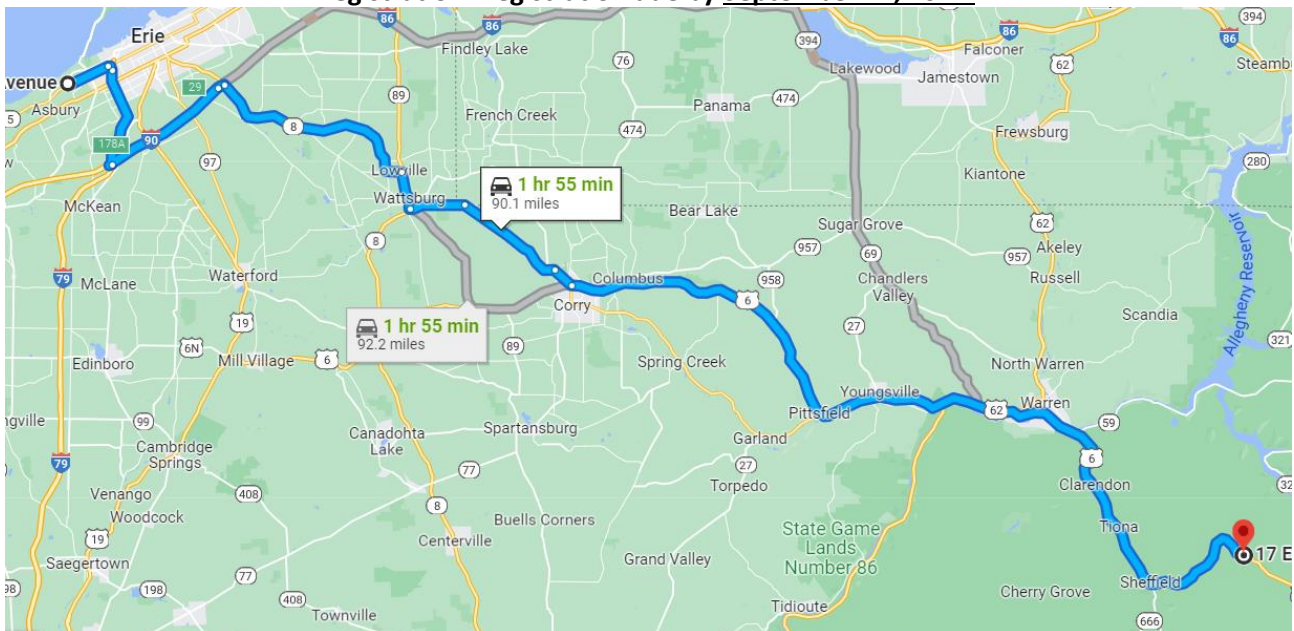

SEASON OF CREATION

As followers of Christ from around the globe, we share a common call to care for creation. We are co-creatures, and part of all that God has made. Our wellbeing is interwoven with the wellbeing of the Earth. We rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all beings who share it. This year, the theme for the season is **Listen to the Voice of Creation**. The Season "Celebration" **begins on 1 September, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations.** This year we will unite around the theme, "Listen to the Voice of Creation." The Psalmist declares, "The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims God's handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge... their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the Earth, and their words to the end of the world." (19: 1-4) During the Season of Creation, our common prayer and action can help us listen for the voices of those who are silenced. In prayer we lament the individuals, communities, species, and ecosystems who are lost, and those whose livelihoods are threatened by habitat loss and climate change. In prayer we center the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor. May this 2022 Season of Creation renew our ecumenical unity, renewing and uniting us by our bond of Peace in one Spirit, in our call to care for our common home. And may this season of prayer and action be a time to Listen to the Voice of Creation, so that our lives in words and deeds proclaim good news for all the Earth.

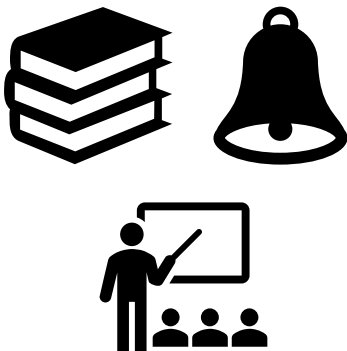

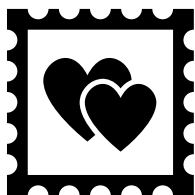
Lord,

ELCA's "God's Work. Our Hands." witness is scheduled for September 11, 2022 or any other day this fall that works well for congregations. The NWPA Synod Green Team encourages congregations and individuals to consider getting your hands "green" by taking actions that demonstrate care for God's creation. Following are some suggestions. You and your congregation may know of other local needs that could be addressed. Please consider including a GREEN activity in your congregation's "God's Work. Our Hands." day of activities.

- **Stream cleanup** - Keep American Beautiful - <https://www.keeppabeautiful.org/programs/pick-up-pa/> International Coastal Cleanup in September. Litter abounds along many waterways it's a great opportunity to take action.

- **Organize a letter writing/email/phone campaign** to state and national leaders to show your support for legislation and funding that reflects creation care. Regardless of the position your elected official may have taken in the past, it doesn't hurt to let them know that you support creation care. Within Pennsylvania, ELCA has an advocacy office in Harrisburg, Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa), that makes our concerns known. LAMPa's work helped achieve 2022-23 state budget including increases in creation care spending, as detailed here: <https://www.lutheranadvocacypa.org/creation-care-education-and-housing-get-boost-in-state-budget/>
- **Plant native** trees, shrubs, flowers and grasses on properties owned by your congregation, members or get permission for plantings on public properties.
