




### MAY PHLOCKING PHUN

### **ORANGE CREAMSICLE JELLO SHOTS**

### **Ingredients:**

3 oz. orange Jell-O

1 C. hot water

1/2 C. orange Gatorade

1/2 C. vanilla vodka

1/2 t. vanilla extract

### **Instructions:**

Mix orange Jell-O and hot water until dissolved.

Add Gatorade, vanilla vodka and vanilla extract and stir to combine all ingredients.

Pour into Jell-O shot glasses and chill until set.

### **TACO SALAD**

Always a favorite summer salad.

### **Ingredients:**

1 lb. ground turkey (or beef)

1 1/2 C. salsa

1 t. dried oregano

1 t. chili powder

1/2 t. sea salt

1/4 t. ground pepper

1 head of romaine lettuce, torn

2 avocados, chopped

8 cherry tomatoes, halved

1 C. shredded Mexican cheese blend

1 can ripe olives, drained and halved

1 can black beans, drained

1 c. sour cream

1 bag chili cheese corn chips

### **Instructions:**

In a large saucepan, cook meat over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Stir in 1/2 cup of the salsa, oregano, chili powder, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 10 minutes. In a large bowl, combine the lettuce, avocado, tomatoes, cheese, olives and meat mixture. Pour remaining 1 cup of salsa over salad and toss to coat. Top with sour cream and sprinkle with corn chips, serve immediately.

### ICE CREAM SANDWICH DESSERT

This is guaranteed to cool you off!

### **Ingredients:**

24 store-bought ice cream sandwiches

1 C. caramel sauce

1 C. chopped pecans

1 (8 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed in the refrigerator

### Instructions:

Spray a 9x13-inch baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. Layer 11-12 ice cream sandwiches over the bottom of the baking dish, cutting sandwiches as necessary to make an even layer. Drizzle 1/3 cup caramel sauce over the ice cream sandwich layer and sprinkle with 1/3 cup chopped pecans.

Layer remaining ice cream sandwiches over the pecan layer, cutting sandwiches as necessary to make another even layer. Drizzle with 1/3 cup caramel sauce and sprinkle with 1/3 cup chopped pecans.

Spread whipped topping evenly over second pecan layer. Drizzle remaining 1/3

cup caramel sauce over whipped topping layer and sprinkle with remaining 1/3 cup chopped pecans. Cover with foil and place in the freezer for at least an hour before serving. Store any leftovers in the freezer.
