

Fall greetings!

Congregation Care: Calvary has an active prayer list. Two of the ways to request prayer support are to have a name placed on the prayers of the church which is the printed in the weekly bulletin and the monthly newsletter. The second is a more private email list of Prayer Warriors.

Community Care: For the next few months, we will be focusing on drawing in the people who are already in our building, through preschool, AA, blood drives, etc. Along those lines, Anita created a new bulletin board in the narthex, giving guests in our building an idea of what our church is about. The Preschool kickoff worship and BBQ went well with 47 people in worship, including 3 preschool staff and 4 Preschool families. We will put up flyers around the building for the Blessing of the Animals service and Trunk or Treat event, inviting all to join us.

Worship: We have moved back to communion by intinction. This will help decrease the expense and waste of plastic cups. New communal wine and juice goblets have been commissioned and new paraments for the altar have been ordered through memorial fund. The hinge of the fallboard on the piano needs to be repaired. We are still looking for a volunteer coordinator.

Property team: The behind-the-scenes work continues at Calvary. Weekly mowing by Dave Rabon and Gary Clark. Garden watering, weeding, shrub pruning by Anita Hiebel, Don and Maria Hudock, and Gary C. A huge Thank You! to the great gardening crew who answered the call to weed the strip along Jackson School Rd, Don H, Dave R, Ross Patton, Dina and Dave Moore! Gary C has trimmed two truck of trimmings this month.

New protocols have been set up for use of the kitchen and dishwasher/sanitizer. Frank Hiebel and Don H working on areas of the building exterior. Dave R is meeting with painting contractors to get an idea of the cost to paint Calvary's exterior in the coming year. Pastor Sal of Life Center Pentecostal will be making some of the needed repairs.

Thrivent mortgage: The balance is under \$8,000. An additional \$1,000 gift was made toward the mortgage balance and will be sent in with the next payment. This will bring our pay-off date to April 2025. Your additional gifts and donations are making a difference to general fund!

Safety and Security during Sunday worship: The Synod is having a De-escalation training was attended by Ross, Anita and Leslie. One of the basic principles and attitudes presented was to treat people as people. We were given a printout summarizing de-escalation basics, which is available if you would like a copy.

Let us remember the words of Alexander Shaia, by the grace of God: we bow to release, rise to wait, open to receive, and step out to serve.




