
Dear M. Baird,

Also in one of the photos you will see the grey totes (bins) that had fell on my back and neck on Feb. 6/97. I felt that you would be interested to see a few of the photos that I have personally obtained while working with Canadian Tire.

I am greatly concerned about the safety factor when loading and unloading of the trucks at C.T.C., also the fact that because, I work for Action Force and not C.T.C. they can and do release drivers and agency personnel at " the drop of a hat". I feel after discussions with other drivers and Canadian Tire staff that sometimes there appears to be a pattern amidst the release of a agency driver shortly after a injury (for what ever the reason maybe).
