I wanted to let all of our citizens know that we are still looking good for a community safe room in Carterville.

Although still faced with the sad fact that we do not have a shelter at this time, we believe that the 2014 season will be the last year without one. I have spoken with the Webb City school district and they have submitted the plans for the Carterville Elementary shelter for state approval. If all goes as planned, they will break ground between September and December of this year. The plan is to have this structure built and ready for use around April 2015.

Community Parks and Recreation News

I will have to be the first to admit, I never thought the idea of a large recreational complex would ever happen, but we are one-step closer to it. As I mentioned in the last newsletter, I have been trying to find a way to acquire some land and funding for this idea without cost to the citizens. Since then I have had the honor of accepting an 18-acre donation from a very generous donor to make this dream a reality. The property is the large undeveloped area just west of our water tower and North of Poplar Street. This will give us room for a large walking/biking trail, a baseball field, soccer field, and playground. There is even a chance we may be able to have a skate park for our teens and room enough for festivals and community events. Now as you can imagine the amenities to fill this park no doubt cost an arm and a leg, but I have submitted a grant application a couple of weeks ago and now we must wait..The grant, if accepted will not cost the citizens anything either. At this time, the 55% cash match is being covered by the value of the donated property. I would like to also take the time to thank the citizens who attended the town hall meeting to give me some input and direction with this project.



Carterville tries new method to rehab old sewers

Recently our crew, with the help of Walden Associates have installed new liners in 5 of our very worst manholes. This process consists of a put in place lining system which when activated becomes an unimaginably hard, fiberglass-like shell to take the shape of the manhole or even the sewer line. This method allows us to avoid the cost of digging up and replacing the entire manhole and can be done in a fraction of the time with years of use.



Potential development for veterans

The city has been in talks with the Harry S Truman Coordinating Council over the past two months in regards to bringing affordable veteran housing to town. The initial phases would consist of multiple duplexes and possibly some multi-family housing in later phases. This plan hinged on both funding approval for the HSTCC and a donation of land from Webb City. The land located on the west side of town was graciously approved for donation to the council last night and preliminary engineering studies have already been performed for the infrastructure.
