Important Announcement

Proof of Residence: Each year all new and returning students must provide a Proof of Residence document:

1. A deed, mortgage, lease, current home owner's or renter's insurance declaration page, or current real property tax bill;
2. A utility bill or receipt of utility installation issued within ninety days of enrollment;
3. A paycheck or paystub issued to the parent or student within ninety days of the date of enrollment that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence;
4. The most recently available bank statement issued to the parent or student that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence;
5. Any other official document issued to the parent or student that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence.

***NEW* Zanesville Community High School's Urban (indoor) Garden**



We have designated space to have an, inside, urban garden where we will grow vegetables and herbs. Students will learn the process of growing their own food to make healthy recipes. ***New* ROTC The U.S. Army Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps - 6000**

The U.S. Army Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) is a program offered to high schools that teaches students character education, student achievement, wellness, leadership, and diversity. It is a

cooperative effort between the U.S. Army and the high schools to produce successful students and citizens, while fostering in each school a more constructive and disciplined learning environment.

The outcomes of the JROTC program are: • Act with integrity and personal accountability as they lead others to succeed in a diverse and global workforce • Engage civic and social concerns in the community, government, and society • Graduate prepared to excel in post-secondary options and career pathways • Make decisions that promote positive social, emotional, and physical health • Value the role of the military and other service organizations

With the school's support, the JROTC program achieves these outcomes by using a world-class 21st Century, technology driven, student centered curriculum. The curriculum consists of education in citizenship, leadership, social and communication skills, physical fitness and wellness, geography, and civics. This course could replace Physical Education. A PE waiver form will be required. Grade: 9-12 Length: Year Prerequisite: None Credit: 1.0
