Land for Louden Cemetery came from him. Moses and Emeline had 7 children including Hiram, who died during the Civil War. Due to his service in 1881 a GAR post was created in Montpelier named in his honor. Their son Harrison had 2 sons, Willard & Charles, who owned Louden Department Store on Empire St. for many years.</i>
