AUXILIARY NEWS

Our plans to ask businesses for raffle donations seemed to go well. At our June meeting it was decided to canvas a number of businesses in the 23 Mile Road and Gratiot area asking for items for the September baby shower at the Detroit VA Hospital and for our Birthday Raffle in November. President Maureen Ailor, Sr. Vice Loretta Balderson and Treasurer Irene Spooner met for lunch to discuss our strategy. After lunch with donation letters in hand, we hit about a half dozen stores in the area. Depending on a store's corporate policy, some were more receptive than others. Only one, Lowes, gave a raffle item on the spot. Some needed to process our request through their corporate offices before they could commit to a donation and a couple of stores indicated they supported veterans in a different way. So, we'll see how this works out and plan to do this again within the next couple of months.

On a separate note, Sr. Vice Loretta Balderson donated a bag full a hand sewn coloring book bags complete with coloring books and crayons for Operation Little Angel at the June Conference in Flint. President Ailor was more than happy to present these at the conference as well as other items that Auxiliary members donated for that very worthy cause.

What is Operation Little Angel? Good question and one that has been asked every time our Auxiliary gets a request for a donation. Operation Little Angel is a charity started and sustained by the MCLA. In 2000 a National Marine Corps League Auxiliary President and two police officers, also members of the Marine Corps League Auxiliary (MCLA) put their heads, hearts and minds together and the Operation Little Angel© (OLA) program was formed. It started out small with only the idea of stuffed toys being put into police vehicles to be given to frightened children. The dream grew and today, not just toys, but clothing, food and items necessary for survival are placed in the hands of those agencies that can best serve the "little angels" who are the most vulnerable victims of crime and abuse.

Departments and Units can support local agencies on their own under the name of Operation Little Angel or they can collect funds and needed supplies and bring their donation to specific events: the Mid-Winter Conference held in February/March or the August National Convention. As you can see, this is a very good cause and one worth our time and effort



to support.

President Ailor and Treasurer Spooner also had the opportunity to visit the new Michigan Veterans Homes in

Chesterfield Township. It's a beautiful facility situated on the former site of military housing for those stationed at Selfridge. It's on Sugarbush Road. next to the Chesterfield Township municipal

offices. It has capacity for 128 veterans or other eligible individuals. Michigan has two other Veteran Homes, one in Grand Rapids and one in Marquette. This facility is divided into 4 neighborhoods, each measuring 29,000 square feet, with each having a shared kitchen, dining room and community room and private bedrooms for the residents. All buildings are connected by heated and air-conditioned corridors ensuring ease of movement, all surrounding a 33,000 square foot community center. Eight veterans have already moved into the facility in Chesterfield with more on the waiting list. We want to thank all Unit and Detachment members for attending the Memorial Day ceremonies at Clinton Grove Cemetery, downtown Mt. Clemens and in Utica. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

The following is adapted from what I shared at the Utica Memorial Day event.

While a seminary student in Birmingham, Alabama I "served" as the chaplain for the local Marine Corps reserve unit. These Marines had returned from Iraq two years prior and needed someone to care for them, so I was breaking all of the rules by "serving as their chaplain." I didn't get paid or collect reserve drill points but I would go to the field with them and be present when they needed someone.

In March 2008 the unit was in Fort Rucker Alabama for a weekend field exercise. On Friday, Lance Corporal David Miles came up to me and introduced himself. He was a new Marine, just finished boot camp and was struggling with how to be a Christian and a Marine at the same time. David and I spent some time together on Friday and Saturday talking through these issues. He was one of only a few Marines that attended the worship service on Sunday.

Later that day, the Marines boarded their charter bus to head home to Birmingham Alabama. The driver of the bus was speeding on the winding road on base, overcorrected and the bus flipped. Five of my Marines were ejected from the bus. One paralyzed from the waist down, several with major injuries, and David Miles was left unconscious and placed on life support.

On Monday after his mother and father arrived, David was taken off life support and he entered eternity knowing that he was going to the Lord he loved. I was able to share with David's family the conversations we had and the hope found in the Lord. They asked me to preach David's funeral and lent me his bible. In it were these words he had written "I want something good to die for, to make it beautiful to live."

Service to and love for one's nation are good things, and because of service members like David we have a great opportunity to live beautiful lives. My encouragement for us this Independence Day is to look for that beauty in our lives so that we may honor the words of David and honor all of our fallen heroes. Thank you for allowing me to keep David's memory alive by sharing his story. May each of you be blessed in your own service to those in your lives.

HISTORIAN'S CORNER

25 years ago in Marine Corps History

30 Jul 1996 - General Charles C. Krulak, 31st Commandant of the Marine Corps, unveiled his plan "Transformation" that would be a process of making Marines for the 21st century. General Krulak's vision of what the 21st century holds for U.S. Marines led to a new approach in training Marines for warfighting. The Commandant called for making Marines tougher physically, mentally and morally. The biggest change would occur in the eleventh week of boot camp when both male and female recruits would be tested by the "Crucible," a 54-hour event which would offer highly focused physical and mental challenges. Major changes under the transformation program would begin at the recruit depots during October.

NATIONAL VETERAN RESOURCES MOBILE UNIT VISITS AM LEGION POST 351



The National Veteran Resources Mobile Unit is a non-profit 501C3 raising awareness to PTS, mental health and suicide. Since 2017, the National Veteran Resources Mobile Unit (pictured above) has traveled more than 90,000 miles, from city to city and state to state providing Resources for Active-Duty Military (Including National Guard and Reservists) and Veterans. Their stated mission is "to help active-duty military, veterans and first responders get the help they need for PTS and to help prevent suicide in our nation's heroes". Their newest initiative is MAVS (Mothers Against Veteran Suicide.)

The mobile unit stopped by the American Legion Post 351 on Sunday June 27. Michele Ladd is the founder of this group bringing awareness and help to those in need. Jr. Vice John Myroniuk reported that although the event was small in attendance, it did save a life, renewed the spirit of a mother of a recently fallen veteran of suicide, and provided information to veterans in attendance to assist other fellow veterans. This was the unit's 2nd stop and has unfortunately 40 more visits to go to provide comfort to those moms who have lost veteran or first responders sons or daughters to suicide.
