December 9, 2018 Second Sunday of Advent Lk 3:1-6

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church Family,

"Every valley shall be filled....every hill made low,....and the rough way made smooth!" No, this is not the commercial for Domino's 'Paving for Pizza' Campaign! That campaign is the pizza delivery company helping ensure a safe home delivery of its pizzas, where they go patch and fill potholes, smoothing out bumps in the road. That is clever! Sounds like Domino Pizza is stepping up, to do the job of broken governments that can't keep roads safe (but it also gets the Domino Brand stamped on to city roads in the process- at least an advertising sign!). But in our gospel today, this quote about 'leveling and even-ing roads' is from the prophet Isaiah (Luke 3:5, Isaiah 40:4). John the Baptist uses these words of Isaiah to announce the call for the world to prepare the way for God's coming. Imagine it similar to a city cleaning the streets and rolling out the red carpet to welcome an important leader to town. Isaiah and John call us to make preparations and be ready to properly receive the Lord Jesus when he comes again. Are we ready for His coming? What are the valleys and hills that need leveling in our lives? Do we have rough patches that need smoothing? Another way of approaching our Advent work, would be to ask, "How do people get ready to receive house guests?" They clear a path through the garage or the mud room (where normally we throw everything when we come home rushed and tired) to get into the house. Or we clean and clear off the dinner table before having supper with them. So, to get ready for Jesus' coming, we need to open a space in our lives to be able to welcome His visit. Normally we call that process conversion and repentance (decluttering or cleaning up). If radical conversion with our baptism and discipleship has already happened in our lives, then we call this ongoing preparation our 'daily prayer and practice of faith'. If good relationship to Christ is already in place, then what else do we have to do? Maybe then we just tidy up and put on some finishing touches, instead of a full-on deep cleaning! But we still have those little things to accomplish before bringing Jesus fully into our lives. Our daily prayer and faith practices keep us in contact with Jesus to 'preset' our meet. Everyone needs spiritual daily maintenance and adjustments, so we keep to our prayer times with God, to keep us focused on Christ and His kingdom. The season of Advent helps us to cut through the chaotic activity around us to check how we are doing in living up to the title 'Christian'. How does my personal space look? What do I need to clear out or clean up? Is something crowding up my days, or taking valuable time or resources away from my family or other life obligations? How are my days being used? Do I spend too much time browsing, or checking updates, or posting to others on media what may or may not be constructive? Do I have a habit or hobby that takes me away from good family-time or God-time? If so, then Advent is the time to make changes to create greater space for God. Advent invites us to find balance, to even out our schedule and responsibilities, to keep good time for all needs.

John Baptist and Isaiah also remind us that we all seek a smooth road in life. We all seek a leveling out of highs and lows. I call that peace! Psalm 62:6 tells us, "My soul, be at rest in God alone, from whom comes our hope." Amid a chaotic world, we need to regulate. Bring down the high points, and raise up the low ones. God's peace in Christ, creates a level consistency and even approach to accomplishing and feeling satisfaction about any achievement, or frustration. Like a good athlete who finds 'flow' or is 'in the zone', we prepare the way for the Lord's coming by keeping faith and keeping focused. Smooth out the rough patches and fill in the bumps along the way, this is a road we want to stay on. It is the Way with Jesus. Another word for consistency is faithfulness or perseverance. St Paul told Timothy "Proclaim the Word, persevering in season and out of season, when it is convenient and inconvenient" (2 Tim 4:2). Jesus taught, "The one who perseveres to the end will be saved" (Matthew 24:13) and even in the Old Testament we find that the source of peace comes from faithful patience through highs and lows when Habakkuk says "See, the rash have no integrity; but the just one who is righteous, because of faith, shall live" (Hab 2:4). God brings patient stability.
