AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Derecho Cleanup Continues Here

The August 10 derecho windstorm that created so much damage is still creating work at the Amana Elementary School where the wind damaged a significant portion of the flat roof on the school directly above the offices and elementary classrooms.

Principal Ben Macumber said that the roof is being repaired now. Insulation has been stacked north of the parking lot at the school and now these sheets of insulation are being used as the roof repairs continue this week and next.

Meanwhile the construction of new restrooms and repairs to the smaller picnic pavilion at the Middle Amana Park will have to be pursued in the spring.

Laura Sue Woods, Amana RV Park director, noted that the derecho completely destroyed the cement block restroom building at the park as a large, oak tree fell upon it. The rubble was removed in October.

A portion of the smaller picnic pavilion was significantly damaged when another oak tree fell upon the corner of the building breaking the upright support post and the metal roof. The structure is still standing but has been roped off.

The Amana Society which owns and manages the park has the structures insured and is currently negotiating for insurance reimbursement, but it's certain that the reimbursement will not cover the cost of entirely replacing the restroom. "We're hopeful the insurance will cover a reasonable amount of the replacement cost," Woods acknowledged.

Garling Construction is currently drawing up plans for a new restroom at the park and construction will take place in the spring. Eastern Iowa Building is to repair the pavilion.

The Amana Society Forestry will be planting trees at the park too, though thankfully, oak trees were donated and planted by Whirlpool in 2019 and these have taken hold. Additionally trees planted in memory of Clifford Trumpold and trees gifted via sister program with the Ronneburg in Germany are thriving, so while nine of the large oak trees had to be removed, there are young trees growing.

The goal, Woods explained, is to have the park ready for the Iowa Renaissance Festival which is slated to return in May, 2021.

The Amana Society cares for the park and pays for lawn mowing, garbage removal, upkeep and property taxes for the park, it recoups a small portion of these costs by renting the pavilion and the building for events and overnight camping. It allows open public access to residents and free access for youth sports, youth events, the local soccer and volleyball leagues, community picnics.

Tannenbaum Forest Opening Weekend News

Fewer people visited Amana's Tannenbaum Forest during its opening weekend compared to previous years, but it was still a solid showing.

Without Santa and with COVID-19, Friday and Sunday were slow, but Saturday over 500 people visited the forest according to volunteers who greeted guests. Face masks are required for all but very small children and social distancing is being built-in to the event.

"Everyone was super about there not being a Santa on duty. . . . it's just a different kind of year and people get that," said one of the Sunday volunteers.

Volunteers were asked to limit the number of people in the forest to 15 at any one time. Doing so seemed to work well according to Lorna Yoder, Hills Bank and Trust Co. She and her teenage children drove from Hills to volunteer in the forest. She explained that counting the admissions and asking people to wait a bit if need be went smoothly. She and her kids were among the 23 volunteers who helped in the forest this past weekend.

"We found out that as this is on private property and with all the space we have, next week we can allow 30 people in at a time," reported Elise Heitmann, Amana Colonies events coordinator. She and the Amana Merchants Association managing have been carefully following the COVID-19 prevention precautions checking with the State Board of Health when they have a question. Increasing the number to 30 will be helpful this upcoming weekend as temperatures are supposed to drop for Prelude to Christmas. Again, face masks are required in the Forest.

This procedure takes a little longer than a whole blood donation (~20 min) and has some different qualifications: Male donors must be 5'1", 130lbs; Female donors must be 5'5", 150lbs and the deferral time is 112 days.
