With competitive round-robins of four players, all entrants in this Sunday's (March 19) Welcome Spring Open Scholastic Chess Tournament will go home with either a first-place trophy or a runners-up chess medal.

As of March 15, over 40 entries had been received and players were being urged to join quickly or risk being left out because the limit of 60 could be reached very soon. This tournament is especially good for first- or second-

time tournament players due to the number of low-rated and unrated entrants and the guarantee of going home with at least a chess medal. In addition, there will be at least a dozen draw prizes ranging from chess books to Subway gift cards.
