

Rhonda and Fred Zeigler started Ohiopyle Vacation Rentals in 2010. "Dad had been buying properties over the years. "It was hand constructed from high end woods and rough cut lumber. It is a luxury tree house, a Honeymoon Suite or any occasion. It offers a king bed, kitchen, outdoor deck overlooking the creek. The largest wedding held at Ferncliff to date had 400 guests. Most range from 200 – 250, but they can accommodate 500



with plentiful parking.

Timber Ridge Lodge & Event Barn accommodates 300 people, Whispering Pines is Dutch Village style with a stream and bridge holding 250 guests and the Granary welcomes 400.



Lord Palumbo's Kentuck Knob

Celebrates 20 Years Open to the Public



Lord Peter Palumbo chats with author Marci Lynn McGuinness about Kentuck Knob, the Frank Lloyd Wright home he fell in love with in 1985.

The Hagans had the property on the market for three years. He felt he must do something about it.

"Fate was waiting in the wings," Lord Palumbo

When Lord Palumbo first arrived at Hagan's Kentuck Knob, the Frank Lloyd Wright house above Ohiopyle, there was no one there. "The house was waiting for me," he told McGuinness. "Fate was playing its hand. You should always go along with it in total agreement."

It was 1985. A long time art collector and owner of architecturally outstanding homes, he strongly felt, "The property should be loved, cherished and maintained as far into the future as anyone can see." Six weeks later, he purchased the home and lived there several months each year for a decade.

Wright never visited the site of Kentuck Knob before designing. The 86 year old had Bernadine and I. N Hagan visit him in 1954, interviewed them and said, "I'll shake a design out of my sleep." In 1956, they moved into the one story sandstone home with a breathtaking view.

In 1997, Peter and Hayat Palumbo opened the masterpiece to the public. At first students were requesting visits. Today 33,000 to 35,000 tour the home each year. A repository for Lord Palumbo's pottery, artifacts and artwork, the home is so welcoming that many say, "We love this house. We feel we could bring our pj's and settle right in."

Our region has become dear to the Palumbo family.

"Pennsylvania is a most magical state," he shared.

At 82, he is hoping to spend more than the usual four months per year at their beloved abode.

"It is a great privilege and pleasure to own Kentuck Knob. It is very special, a work that is representative of the Usonian category of house by the United State's best architect."

The family dog, Lilly, spent the afternoon with us, often greeting visitors. Kentuck Knob has a euphoric feel to it, a soft openness.



Buying Houses from those in Need in Fayette County, PA

"Josh wanted to do something that helped other people and he was interested in real estate," Jordan DeGusipe said. "He came to me and said 'Let's start buying houses.' I said 'How? Why?'"

"We can help them move. People who can't afford closing costs and repairs," he told his new wife.

"We bought a duplex. A family friend needed to get out from under her house. We did the repair work ourselves and rented it out. Another woman wanted to sell. We bought her house in as-is condition, moved her. We pay all closing costs so that all the profit goes to the seller. If someone needs to sell quickly, we have closed in three days before. It is just the two of us, but we are the largest team of private home buyers in Fayette County. It keeps people from losing their houses or losing profits to a real estate agent.

Avoid Foreclosure!

"The government banks on the selling process being longer than they can hold out. "We have a full time person who also works for us working on the houses. We had a producer approach us about doing a television show about the process. We have not heard from them for a while, but signed a nine month agreement. It has been rewarding. People who can't sell because of the condition of their house, people who live elsewhere and inherit homes here, many just can't afford repair costs to get their homes up to standards for inspection.



"We have come up with systems that work for us. So far we have bought 10 homes in a year. We look at a lot more, but the house has to work for us. Some homes can not be fixed.


We are growing right now. We have a lawyer who handles the closing, but we do the rest of the work. We redo them and rent them out. Some of the situations we get in really are made for TV," she laughed.

"It is a nice feeling all around to be able to help our community.

New Yough Riverkeeper for Mountain Watershed Association



Eric Harder, the new Youghiogheny Riverkeeper, came to Ohio Pyle, Pennsylvania with his now wife, Brynn Cunningham. They met on the Chatooga River, both photo boaters back then. Eric is from Wisconsin, but has fallen for the Youghiogheny River, like millions of other lucky travelers.

He acquired an education about the gas & oil industries while employed with All Star Ecology in Fairmont, West Virginia the past five years, but always wanted to work for the health of our waterways.

Eric started his position with the Mountain Watershed Association in Melcroft, Pennsylvania this summer as the advocate of a clean Youghiogheny River basin. The Riverkeeper acts as a voice for the people of the watershed if they feel their water rights are being compromised. He also works to raise awareness of watershed health and the steps individuals and communities can take to get organized to tackle the problems.

The MWA is presently creating a comprehensive monitoring plan for the Youghiogheny River Basin from Oakland, MD to McKeesport, PA, and participates in the Swimmable Waters Program, collecting water at popular swimming areas to test for E. coli pollution. One of their most recent successes was halting all horizontal directional drilling for the Mariner East II pipeline. The method of drilling resulted in a lot of drilling fluid spills in our region which have contaminated our waterways and treasured recreational sites such as Loyalhannaha Lake. Agencies are taking a closer look at the permits to be sure everything is in order. They are also keeping an eye on the Allegheny Energy Center proposed power plant in Elizabeth Township. This planned power plant on the Yough, will have a withdraw and outflow and will effect river temperature.

Working with the Fayette County Conservation District, the Riverkeeper will be holding meetings to increase awareness on septic systems and their maintenance as many townships create new policies. He will also be speaking on agricuture management like fencing streams to keep farm animals out and cleaning up feedlots.

gWe monitor any new mining, development, fracking, anything that comes up we want to make sure that the rules are followed for the water's protection. We put the word out. Any kind of watershed degradation will affect our recreational economy. There is so much recreational based economy up and down the bike trail, the Youghiogheny River watershed's health is vital."



Brynn Cunningham...

"I guess when you're growing up as a kid you are always outside running. But I was 11 when I decided to set aside time to run as something I wanted to do. It was because of Mr. Everhart. He took us for a trail run behind Wharton School and I fell in love with it. "In high school we had to lift weights to train for the team. There were different components to it. I got your (Mom, Marci McGuinness) Denise Austin book and started to work out. I loved it. I used little weights and joined the soccer team. I tried to get the Athletic Director to let me use the weight room during lunch at school, but I was told that it was for boys only.

"I started to get up before school and use our spin bike and weight bench. This is what I do now. I wake up and do something physical to set the tone for the day. It made me feel more centered and balanced. It still does. I discovered yoga at the YMCA when I was 18. I was told that it would be good for running.

"It was during the summer I was 21 when I started going to Yogi Wade's. My whole body felt better. Sitting was easier. I noticed when I didn't go little aches and pains would show up.

Tara Morris...

"I guess when I was a teenager I did the fun stuff, biking, hiking, swimming in the river. I wasn't into competitive sports. We were used to playing outside growing up.

"Brynn and I did workouts from *Seventeen Magazine* through high school. That is what you did (Mom) and our Dad, worked out at home. It was something we liked to do. It wasn't like a chore. We enjoyed it. "I liked to feel strong. I continued to boat and became a raft guide after college. I was living in Asheville, NC the six months before raft guide training on the Chatooga River. That is when yoga really hooked me. "The raft guiding had me so contorted and twisted and I started having neck pain. I got weak then I had a raft dropped on me from the top of a school bus. That tore my back out.

"I moved home and eventually started going to Yogi Wade's class in Ohiopyle. This was 2009. I knew I had to make a big change for my health. I needed to get off the river. It took a lot to get away from it. I wanted to teach yoga because I wanted to help other people.

Wade hooked me up with Yoga Flow in Murraysville. I enrolled in the teacher training. It was physically difficult, but I could feel my strength gaining. It really helped mentally. I got certified in 2010. For the past 8 years I have worked on keeping my back stable. I finally got the routine down that I need to keep functioning. All of those things have made me the teacher that I am.

"I love teaching yoga. It is almost like raft guiding. You have to train them how to paddle the river and stay safe. You have to lead. With yoga, you lead your students through a sequence and try to keep them from hurting themselves.

"I do a lot of Yin yoga, four times a week at home. I think it is important to figure out your basic anatomy. There is yoga for everybody. It is fun to go about finding the right one."

Today Tara teaches a Wednesday Power Yin class from 6 to 7:15 pm at LPS, 30 East Main, Uniontown, PA She teaches event classes at LPS like the Dec. 2 Full Moon Flow 6–7pm class with twin Brynn. Their birthday! Tara subs at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.
