My STory



Was born to Garrett and Nellie Kidwell on November 5, 1922. I resided with my family in the northern part of Shelby County as I grew up. I had one brother and four sisters. As I was growing up, I was lovingly called Ginny. My mother still called me that when I was an adult.

I met my future husband, Donald Beckley when I was in school. He was a year ahead of

me. I graduated in 1940, and on January 4, 1941, Donald and I were married.

For the first three years of marriage, Donald was in the Army. He was stationed in New Mexico at one point. Later, we realized that he was there while they were making the bomb. At the time he was there, we didn't know. Don was scheduled to ship out overseas during the end of his time in the Army, but didn't go because the war ended before his scheduled departure.

After three years in the Army, we settled just north of Clarence in Shelby County. I wasn't a very good cook in the early years of our marriage. Later, Donald would recall how badly the first pumpkin pie I tried to make turned out. However, with practice, I became quite the cook!

Donald and I had six children; three boys and three girls. When the children were young, I was a busy homemaker. Donald was a farmer. He was very good with the soil and also had livestock such as cows and hogs. Donald was very proud of his farm, and often had me take pictures of cattle, machinery, or a certain crop in the field. Once several of the children were out of the



house, I became a cook at the Clarence Nursing Home.

At this time, I enjoy living at Cedar View Cottage at Loch Haven. In August, I will have been here for one year. My family has grown by leaps and bounds over the years. I have "too many" grandchildren to count! However, my first and only (so far) great-great-grandchild is less than two years old.




Chocolate Chip Cheesecake Bites

Erin Roberts July Guest Chef

24 Oreo cookies
5 -1/3 Tbl. butter, melted
16 oz. cream cheese (2 packages), softened
3/4 cup white sugar
6 tablespoons milk
2 eggs
1/2 cup sour cream
2 tablespoons flour
1 and 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
1 cup mini chocolate chips

Heat oven to 350°F. Line two 12-count cupcake pans with cupcake liners; set aside. Crush Oreo cookies. Pour cookie crumbs in medium bowl and stir in melted butter. Place about one tablespoon of cookie crumb mixture into each cupcake liner and form a crust. Bake 5 minutes.

In large bowl mix together cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add milk and mix. Add eggs one at a time, mixing until just incorporated after each addition. Add sour cream, flour, and vanilla and mix until smooth. Stir in chocolate chips. Pour cheesecake mixture on pre-baked crusts, filling until almost completely full. Place additional chocolate chips on top if desired. Bake 20-21 minutes. Tops will rise considerably but will go back down as cheesecake cools. Allow cheesecake bites to

cool for about 1 hour, then move to refrigerator and chill for 2 hours before serving. Store cheesecake bites in airtight container in refrigerator up to 5 days.

Layered Tortellini Pesto Salad

- 1 (9 oz) package refrigerated cheese tortellini
- 1 cup frozen sweet peas
- 2 cups romaine lettuce, torn
- 1 to 1 1/2 cups julienne (matchstick-cut) carrots
- 2 cups cooked chicken, chopped
- 1 medium red bell pepper, cut into strips
- 2 Tbs mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup basil pesto
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 2 Tbs chopped fresh parsley or basil leaves

Pesto Dressing

In a small bowl, mix mayonnaise, pesto, and buttermilk. Let sit in fridge to chill while preparing rest of salad.

Salad

Cook tortellini as directed on package, adding peas during last 4 minutes of cook time. Drain; rinse immediately with cold water. Pat with paper towels to remove moisture. In a 3 or 4 quart clear bowl, layer your lettuce, carrots, chicken, peas, tortellini, and bell pepper. Top with pesto dressing, garnish with freshly chopped parsley or basil.



"In the Tropics" Zucchini Bread

2 eggs, beaten
1 cup cooking oil
2 cups sugar
3 tsp. vanilla
2 cups grated unpeeled zucchini
3 cups flour
1/4 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp, baking soda

- 1 tsp. salt I cut in half
- 2-1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 can (8 oz.) crushed pineapple, undrained
- 1/2 cup chopped maraschino cherries

1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Mix all ingredients together well, adding pineapple, cherries and nuts last. Put batter in 2 well greased and floured 9 x 5 inch bread pans. Bake at 350 for 1 hour, or until tests done with toothpick, or sharp paring knife. Remove from pans and cool on wire racks.




