

A preposition is a connecting word that shows the relationship between words in a sentence, and elaborates meaning. A prepositional phrase begins with a preposition from the following list. A very common mistake is to match the verb in the sentence to the word at the end of the prepositional phrase, rather than to the subject of the sentence.

By learning to recognize a preposition when you see it, you can avoid this grammatical error.
