Sorry, but ALL parking in original Reflections is OWNED BY THE REFLECTIONS OWNERS' ASSOCIATION, as is all common area parking throughout Reflections. Look at your land plat and that becomes clear.

If you don't like what YOUR Board is doing then run for a seat on the Board. There are several of us who would gladly give up our seats and be rid of the hassle received from residents.

Otherwise we ask your cooperation – if you elect not to lead then follow, or at least get out of the way. Ms. Perry doesn't deserve the abusive phone calls and visits from residents who want a fourth option – to obstruct. Maybe it is time for those individuals to rethink living in Reflections, where all homes form our Association. If you don't like rules, move. Otherwise, lead, follow or get out of the way!
