Entry Fees:

\$20.00 per class for entries done at the show.

\$15.00 per class pre-registration

\$10.00 per class for 4H Members.

Proof of negative coggins within the past 12 months. Proof of Eastern Encephalitis vaccination, tetanus vaccination Rabies vaccination and West Nile Vaccination within the past 12 months. Proof of Equine Influenza Vaccination and Equine Herpes Vaccination within the past 6 months. Must accompany the horse to the show and must be presented at the secretary's booth upon check in.

Acceptable forms of proof are [NJ 4H Horse Health Form](#) dated and signed by your vet. An invoice or signed letter from your vet, or completion of the [USEF Equestrian Vaccination record](#) in accordance with [USEF General Rule 845](#) (please read this rule in detail before using this form).

Class Specifications:

English Grooming and Showmanship-

1. Horses and ponies are to be shown in-hand at halter or bridle at a walk, trot, and pose.
2. Failure to follow prescribed pattern may result in a severe penalty or disqualification based on the decision of the judge.
3. The "Quarter Method" of showing will be used in all Showmanship classes.
4. The pattern will be posted at the state show.
5. Members must have done their own grooming, braiding, training and conditioning without assistance. To be judged according to the "4-H Horse Project Showmanship & Grooming Score Card".

English Halter-

1. Horses in this class must be 2-years of age or older.
2. Mares and geldings are to be shown in-hand in a halter or bridle.
3. To be judged on conformation, soundness, and condition.
4. Each entry will be shown individually at the walk and trot.
5. Only family or member owned horses are eligible for this class.
6. Very Small Equines are not allowed to enter this class.

Hunter Under Saddle – Hunter Type (Both Horse and Pony)

- a. ENTRIES IN THE HUNTER UNDER SADDLE Hunter type CLASS CAN NOT CROSS ENTER in Hunter Under Saddle – Stock Type.
- b. Emphasis is on movement, type, conformation and way of going while maintaining direct contact with the horse's mouth.
- c. Required to perform at the walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena.
- d. A hand gallop may be asked in only one direction of the arena with safety precautions in mind.
- e. No more than 25 riders may be asked to canter at a time, at the discretion of the judge

Hunter Under Saddle – Stock Type – (Both Horse and Pony)

- a. ENTRIES IN THE HUNTER UNDER SADDLE Stock type CLASS CAN NOT CROSS ENTER in Hunter Under Saddle - Hunter Type.
- b. Emphasis is on movement, type, conformation and way of going while maintaining direct contact with the horse's mouth.
- c. Required to perform at the walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena.
- d. A hand gallop may be asked in only one direction of the arena with safety precautions in mind.
- e. No more than 25 riders may be asked to canter at a time, at the discretion of the judge



English Pleasure- Both Horse and Pony

- a. Ride should be suitable to purpose and pleasurable.
- b. Animal should be obedient, alert and responsive to the rider.
- c. A quick, short stride should be penalized, as should horses which move in an artificial frame or are over flexed or behind the bit.
- d. Judges should emphasize free movement, manners, and consistency of gait.
- e. Horses are to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring.
- f. At the Judge's discretion horses will be asked to extend their gaits i.e.: Walk with forward motion, extended trot, and canter with forward motion.
- g. No more than 25 riders may be asked to canter at a time, at the discretion of the judge

Equitation Classes

- a. English Equitation on the Flat-Class is to be judged both ways of the ring at a walk trot and canter, after completion of rail work the judge may ask individuals to test work if necessary.
- b. No more than 25 riders may be asked to canter at a time, at the discretion of the judge.
- c. Riders will enter individually at a trot down the center line and find a place on the rail at ring steward's command.
- d. The rider only is being judged. Riders will be judged on seat, hands, legs, feet, position, balance and control of mount. Suitability of horse to rider shall be considered.

Over Fences Classes

English Equitation Over Fences-

1. The rider only is being judged.
2. The rider will be judged on seat, hands, legs, feet, position, balance and control of the mount.
3. Suitability of horse to rider shall be considered.
4. Individual performance shall consist of riding over a prescribed course of at least eight fences.
5. Fence heights according to size of horse/pony

Size	Height of Fence	In and Out
Small Pony	2'3"	20'
Medium Pony	2'3"	22'
Large Pony	2'6"	24'
Horse	2'6"	25'



Handy Working Hunter-

1. To be shown over a course of eight jumps.
2. Fences shall simulate those found in trappy hunting country.
3. Horses/ponies are required to trot over one fence toward the end of the course and may be asked to lead over a cross rail not to exceed (2') in height.
4. Fence heights according to size of horse/pony

Working Hunter

1. To be shown over a course of eight jumps.
2. Fences shall simulate those found in the hunting field.
3. Fence heights according to size of horse/pony

Small Pony	2'3"	20'
Medium Pony	2'3"	22'
Large Pony	2'6"	24'
Horse	3'0"	25'

Hunter Hack-

1. To be judged 50% on flat work and 50% over fences.
2. All riders are to first show both ways of the ring at a walk, trot, canter, and to hand gallop at least one way.
3. No more than eight entries to hand gallop at one time.
4. The hand gallop may be asked for after the last fence.
5. All entries will be required to jump two fences. Fences shall consist of a set of standards with two rails and a ground rail set to the height for each size of mount.
6. Riders will proceed directly from line-up to first fence. No courtesy circle before first fence.

Size	Height of Fences
Small and Medium Pony	2'3"
Large Pony and Horses	2'6"



Mini Stirrup:

Open to horses & ponies ridden by junior exhibitors 10 years of age & under as of December 1st of the current show year. Riders may have never competed in any division at any horse show competition where cantering is required or fence height is 2' or higher. At that time, the rider is no longer eligible for Mini Stirrup Hunter Division. Fences are cross rails below 18" or rails on ground.

Short Stirrup:

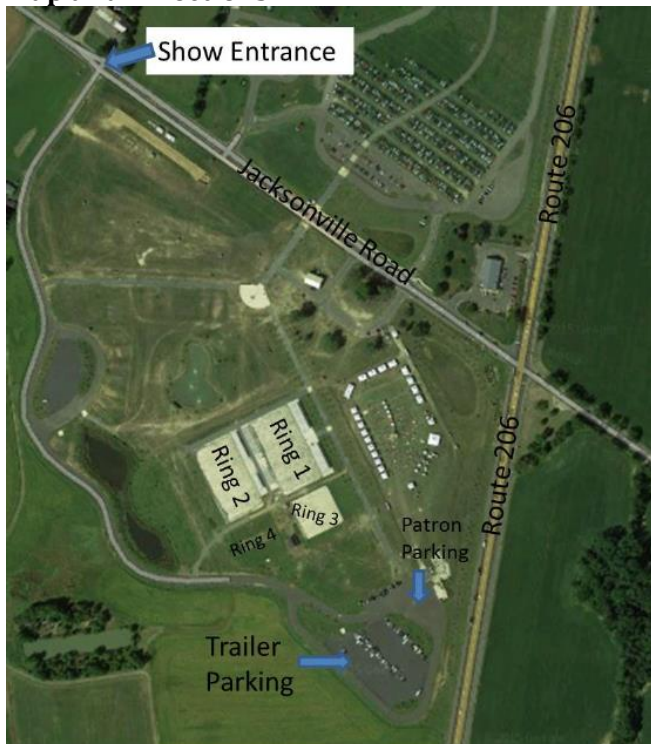
Open to horses & ponies ridden by junior exhibitor 12 years of age & under as of December 1st of the current show year. Riders may have never shown in any division, at any show, where the fence height specifications are 2' or higher. To be shown over a course less than 2' in height. To be judged on manners, performance & suitability. Riders may not cross enter into any other division or class at any competition. This division may be combined with Beginner Rider, if needed.

Beginner Rider:

Open to horses & ponies ridden by riders of ANY age. Fences LESS THAN 2' in height. Section A: Rider may not have shown in a division, at any show, where the fence height specifications are 2' or higher. Riders may not cross enter in any division or class at any competition where fences are 2' or higher. This division may be combined with Short Stirrup, if needed. TROTting ON COURSE NOT TO BE PENALIZED, ALTHOUGH AN UNINTENTIONAL BREAK OF GAIT WILL BE PENALIZED.

Coming from the North via I295: I295 south until exit 57. Exit 57 to Route 130 north. Follow Rt130 north to Route 206 South. Rt 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

Coming from the South via I295: I295 north until exit 56. Turn right onto Rising Sun Road. Turn right onto Route 206 south. Rt 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

Coming from the New Jersey Turnpike: NJ Turnpike (north or south) to exit 7. Follow signs to Route 206 south. Rt. 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

Coming from I195 via rt. 206: I195 to exit 1B. Rt 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

Coming from I195 via rt. 130: I195 to exit 5. Route 130 south to Rt 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

Coming from I195 via NJ Turnpike: NJ Turnpike south to exit 7. Rt 206 south until Jacksonville-Jobstown Road. Turn right. Entrance to fairgrounds on left.

RELEASE OF CLAIMS

With the total understanding that horses are unpredictable and potentially dangerous animals, and that a horse show setting is unpredictable and potentially dangerous itself, and that anything may happen today, I hereby on behalf of myself and my personal representatives, release and forever discharge the Burlington County 4-H Youth Development Program and their respective agents, members, leaders, and their successors and assigns; Burlington County 4-H Horse Advisory Board and their respective officers and members, agents, successors, and assigns; Rutgers, the State University, and their agents, successors, and assigns; the Horse Show Committee and their agents, successors, and assigns; of and from any and all claims and demands of any kind, nature and character which I may or may hereafter acquire or which my personal representatives may hereafter acquire or accrue to them; for any and all damages, losses and injuries which may be suffered or sustained by me, my property, or by the horse(s) utilized in connection with my participation in the Burlington County 4-H Horse Advisory Horse Shows; my association therewith, my entry and participation in shows and events affiliated with any of the aforesaid organizations, my traveling to, training for, and return from such shows and events; and all such claims and demands are hereby waived and released, and I covenant not to sue therefore now or at any future time.

HELMET REGULATION

All riders, youth and adult, must wear a properly fitting equestrian helmet, passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM/SEI (American Society for Testing and Materials/Safety Equipment Institute) standards, with chin strap secured, while mounted at any time/anywhere on the competition/event grounds.

The Burlington County 4-H Youth Development Program, Burlington County 4-H Horse Advisory Council, Horse Show Committee and officials, make no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective equestrian helmet, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such equestrian helmet as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

For our youth riders under 18 years of age, it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to see to it that the equestrian helmet worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition. Riders over age 18 are responsible for their equestrian helmet complying with the standards. The Burlington County 4-H Youth Development Program, Burlington County 4-H Horse Advisory Council, and/or Show Committee, and officials are not responsible for checking equestrian helmet for such compliance.

I, the undersigned rider, parent, guardian, understand that I am responsible to verify that the equestrian's riding helmet complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use. I further attest that the helmet is:
