One of the most well-known sections of the Gospel of Matthew is undoubtedly the Sermon on the Mount. These three chapters (Matthew 5-7) contain a number of Jesus' teachings on a wide range of subjects that are as important for us to study today as they were for Jesus' disciples so many years ago.

Chapter 5 begins: "Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up a mountain. He sat down and his disciples came to him. He taught them..." The disciples of Jesus follow him up a mountain to sit at his feet and hear him teach. They set aside the time necessary to learn from him in preparation of the work that awaited them back down the mountain.

Isn't this what we too are called to do as Christ's modern day disciples? Jesus has called us to be a part of a community. Each and every week, we are given the opportunity to gather with friends, family, and other faithful disciples to hear God's Word, to pray, and to sing. Within our sanctuary walls we are offered rest in Christ's presence and a way to reconnect with the Spirit of God which empowers us to go out into the world to fulfill the work God sets before us.

Throughout February, we will be spending time studying the Sermon on the Mount. There is nothing about these important teachings of Jesus that are easy for us to understand or to live out, but together, we can study them and work to become better disciples and a more faithful community. Let us meet Jesus on the mountain and join together in worship and prayer, so that we can go out into the world to serve others and share God's love.



I hope you have all picked up your annual giving statements for 2016. Did you know that your charitable contributions to the First Presbyterian Church can be deducted from your income taxes? You should consult with a tax agent if you have any questions. Again, you will notice that your giving statements look a little different than you are use to seeing. Please feel free to contact Marsha or Sherri if you have any questions about the new statements.

The Interpretation and Stewardship Committee met in January. There are many pressing matters that have our attention this year. Foremost is the lost general fund revenue from the Lenten fish dinners. The dinners contributed to the general fund to support all the church expenditures. While we reduced our 2017 general fund budget by \$1,200, we will still have a shortfall in 2017.

I & S has been discussing ways to replace the lost revenue. Those discussions brought us to the interpretation of the FPCMR Per Capita obligation. Presbyterians have a form of government built upon shared power and mutual accountability as we seek together to find and represent the Will of Christ. Our per capita obligation is shared among the General Assembly, the Synod, and the Eastminster Presbytery. FPCMR will again send \$32.00 for each 166 active members as of December 31, 2015. Our 2017 Obligation is \$5,312. In 2016, our obligation was \$5,273. If you are willing and able, please consider making a per capita offering to help offset our obligation and fill the void of lost revenue.

The Interpretation and Stewardship Committee is looking forward to a challenging, yet rewarding year in 2017. May God continue to bless you!

Ash Wednesday and Lent are right around the corner! Please plan to join us each Wednesday of Lent for dinner and a time of worship and discussion. Dinner will be served from 6-6:45 each week starting on Ash Wednesday, March 1.
