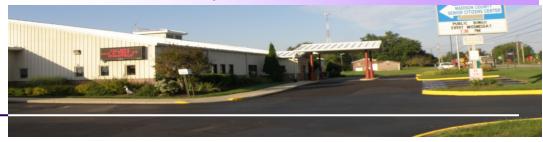

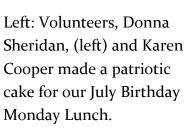

- Communicate with your doctor and family members about your condition
- Be more physically active

But did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. Cranberry Pork Roast

I realize that there are a lot of diabetics here at the center. Unfortunately, diabetes is increasing all the time. So I thought I would include diabetic friendly as well as good tasting recipes for you.

- 2-3 lbs. boneless pork roast, trimmed of excess fat
- 1 cup ground or finely chopped fresh or frozen cranberries
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Place roast into a slow cooker. Mix remaining ingredients and pour over roast. Cover and cook on low for 8-10 hours. Makes 9 servings, 214 calories per serving and only 7 grams of carbs. Enjoy with a nice salad and broccoli.
