This appointment comes with a salary increase from \$24.75 hourly to \$28.10 per hour.

Mayor Stoddard discussed a new outside sewer user (water supplied by the Town) that will be putting up a building near McDonalds.

Treasurer Zurawski said once they fill out the application to tap into our system the Town will provide the reading to the bill the sewer based on their metered water consumption.

Mayor Stoddard mentioned that Maureen Stabak will be our Rail Trail Alliance and thanked Trustee Feasel for being in contact with her.

Mayor Stoddard said that Heather Jacksy would be willing to attend a meeting to discuss the Rail Trail Program.

Mayor Stoddard said she would like to see the Board pass a resolution of support for Ukraine.
