Key Points:

- In a narrow 5-4 decision, the Supreme Court has unfortunately approved Ohio's voter suppression tactics, allowing the state to target infrequent voters for removal and to deprive them of the fundamental right to vote.
- Today's decision threatens the ability of voters to have their voices heard in our elections.
 It is a setback especially for traditionally marginalized communities that are already underrepresented at the ballot box.
- The decision creates a danger that other states will pursue purging practices that will disenfranchise millions of eligible voters across the country.
- But the Court did not green-light purge practices writ large. States may not knock eligible voters off the rolls without providing notice.
- We will continue to fight in the courts, the legislature, and with our community partners to prevent states from erecting barriers to voting.
