Representatives from ROI, the Applied Research Institute (ARI) and Indiana University are conducting meetings with community and business leaders throughout the 11 counties of Southwest Central Indiana to provide updates on activities underway to advance economic and community prosperity across the region.

ROI's mission is to support regional development opportunities in Brown, Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Greene, Lawrence, Martin, Monroe, Orange, Owen and Washington counties – the Southwest Central Indiana region. Through an initial \$25,870,000 grant through Lilly Endowment Inc., ROI is implementing an education and workforce plan and regional opportunity fund for quality-of-place investments.

The coalition is led by a regional board of directors and is affiliated with the Community Foundation of Bloomington and Monroe County (CFBMC).

**BEDFORD** – Limestone Robotics is a youth organization structured to support Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics Education and Robotics (STEAM) in Lawrence and surrounding counties for young people ages five through 18.
