- Use of the beach and other facilities are for BRPOA Members,
 Nonmember Occupants, & Guests
- Swim at your own risk, no lifeguards on duty
- No diving from the seawall or marina
- No dogs or other pets on the beach
- No Alcoholic Beverages or Glass Containers Permitted
- Use of a grill beyond the chain and posts/parking area is not permitted
- Children under 12 MUST be accompanied by Parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age
- BEWARE: Many areas of the lake are more than 5 feet deep and are dangerous for children, non-swimmers, and poor swimmers.
- Swimming beyond the post areas is discouraged.
- Manager on duty may ask any person who acts in an unsafe manner or who violates the Regulations applicable to the beach and swimming areas to leave the area.
- No loud or offensive music will be tolerated.

BRPOA Board of Directors Meeting April 8, 2017

Approval of the Agenda: Davis moved for approval of the amended agenda, Glass seconded and approval was unanimous.

- **Approval of the Minutes:** Minutes for the March 11, 2017 Board meeting were presented and the date for the July 4, 2017 Fireworks was corrected to July 1. Gray moved for approval of the minutes, Furlong seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Safety & Security Committee Chair: Furlong moved to approve John (Rick) Gray as the sole chair of the Safety/Security Committee. Davis seconded and approval was unanimous.
- BRS Vision Statement: Davis moved to accept the BRS Vision Statement as amended. Glass seconded and approval was unanimous.

<u>"We are Blue Ridge Shores, a private gated community known for friendly special events, a variety of recreational facilities, and a unique small town feel. We are neighbors, maintaining our own Lake Louisa for all here to enjoy."</u>

- **Dredging Project Update:** Earhart moved to approve the amended dredging contract with \$123,750 added for (1) remobilization [\$60,000] and (2) development of the dredged materials site [63,750]. Davis seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Quorum at Meetings: (Second reading) BYLAWS of BLUE RIDGE PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC; Section 5. Quorum at Meetings: A quorum at any meeting of members of the Association shall consist of twenty (20%) ten (10%) percent of the members of the Association, present in person or by proxy. Furlong moved for approval Craig seconded; approval was unanimous.
- Revision to Boat Policies, Rules and Regulations, Section III: (Second Reading) Furlong moved approval, Glass seconded; approval was unanimous.

SECTION III Policies, Rules and Regulations

- D. Boats:
- 5. Registration:

(h) The Board of Directors of Blue Ridge Shores requires completion of the Virginia Boating Safety Education Requirement for operation of a boat on Lake Louisa. This requirement will phase in the same manner as the statewide requirement for operation on public waters.

Virginia is requiring that in order to operate a boat on public waters you must have passed a boating safety course or its equivalent examination. While Lake Louisa is exempt from this requirement because it is a private lake, members who own a boat will be required to show proof of compliance to receive their boating registration.

(H) In the interest of safety, the Board of Directors of Blue Ridge Shores requires completion of the Virginia Boating Safety Education Requirements or the equivalent for operation of a boat with ten (10) horsepower or greater on Lake Louisa. The member is required to submit proof of compliance for their file in order to receive their annual boat registration. A member who does not or cannot operate their boat may register the boat if they present proof for their file that a family member has met the Boater Safety Education Requirements, and specify that the family member will operate the boat. All members are required to carry proof of completion of the course while on the lake operating a boat as prescribed in this section. The Association will comply with sections of the State Code on this issue.

The current requirements are:

1. Motorboat operators 20 years of age or younger shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2011.

2. Motorboat operators 30 years of age or younger shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2012.

3. Motorboat operators 40 years of of age or younger shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2013.

4. Motorboat operators 45 years of age or younger shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2014.

5. Motorboat operators 50 years of age or younger shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2015.

6. All motorboat operators, regardless of age, shall meet the requirements by July 1, 2016.

Disposal of Association Property: Earhart moved to accept the best current bid of \$2500 for Lot 177. Davis seconded; approval was unanimous.

- Clean Up of Lots 1195 & 1196, 18 Ellis Lane: (the burned out house) Furlong moved to authorize up to \$8400 to clean up both lots Davis seconded; approval was unanimous.
- Furlong then moved to accept ownership of said lots in lieu of current dues owed. The lots would then be offered for sale; Frago seconded; approval was unanimous.
- Approval of Election Inspectors: Davis moved to approve Doug Frago, Judy O'Keefe, Kathi Coldren, Laverne McCleese, and Jeanette Weaver as the five inspectors for the 2017 Elections associated with the Joint Annual Meeting on May 20, 2017. Amentrout seconded; approval was unanimous.

End of meeting: Motion by Furlong, Seconded by Davis, to adjourn @ 11:00AM, Approval was unanimous.

BRPOA Board of Directors Meeting May 13, 2017

Absent: Dave Armentrout

- Approval of the Agenda: Furlong moved for approval of the amended agenda, Davis seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Approval of the April 8, 2017 Minutes: Minutes for the April 8, 2017 Board meeting were presented .Gray moved for approval of the minutes, Brown seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Treasurer's Report: Earhart moved to accept the Auditors' Report for the 2016 Financial Records, Furlong seconded and approval was unanimous.
- President Furlong then moved for a vote of appreciation to the Treasurer and BRS Office Staff for their efforts that resulted in the 'clean audit'. Frago seconded and the vote was unanimous.
- **Mower Replacement:** Furlong moved to authorize the GM to replace the 2008 defective mower per the five-year plan at a cost not to exceed \$13,000. Frago seconded and approval was unanimous.
- **Dissolve Ad Hoc Committee:** Brown moved to dissolve the Future Vision Committee as the submission of their report indicates their work is done. Davis seconded and approval was unanimous.
- **Disposal of Association Property:** Lots 1195 & 1196, 18 Ellis Lane. Earhart moved to place these lots up for sale with a minimum price of \$15,000. Gray seconded and approval was unanimous.
- **Approval of School Bus Route Certification:** Issue required annually by the Louisa County School Board. Furlong moved to authorize no more than \$600 for the Engineering Certification as proposed. Earhart seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Closing of the Marina, Boat Ramp and South Lakeshore Drive Parade Route: For the July 4 celebration. Furlong moved to authorize the GM to close any BRS common areas as needed for special events or maintenance. Davis seconded and approval was unanimous.
- **Road Rehabilitation per ongoing multiyear schedule:** There was only one bidder for the 2017 road work, Barton & Boyd. Furlong moved to authorize the 2017 Road work as described, at a cost not to exceed \$120,000. Frago seconded and approval was unanimous.
- Streets to be asphalted are Red Cedar Road, Oakhill Road, and Beechnut Drive. There will be nine areas receiving patch work, cracks in the office parking lot will be sealed, and approximately 30 Stop Bars will be Re-painted.
- Timeline for BRS Committee work: Davis presented a yearly outline of the tasks of the Joint Personal Committee and for the Annual Member Survey. He suggested other BRS Committees undertake and present similar reports. That would assist new members and inform the community of some of the functions of the Board and BRS Committees.

End of meeting: Motion by Furlong, Seconded by Davis to Adjourn: 11:00AM All present voted: FOR. Motion passed unanimously.

2017 Boating Policies and Safety Tips


Boating Season is here and we hope everyone has a 2017 Fun but Safe experience. Blue Ridge Shores adopted the provisions of the **Virginia Boating Safety Education Requirement** for operation of a motorized boat on Lake Louisa. The Virginia Conservation Police Department has authority to enforce all provisions of State Requirements on Lake Louisa. Just a few reminders for everyone:

- Anyone operating a motorized boat in Virginia must possess a card indicating they have taken the **Virginia Boater Safety Education Class** or the State's Safety Class where the boat is registered.
- Operators must be at least 14 years old.
- Boats must be registered to a member or a non-member occupant who are members in good standing.
- All motorized boats must be registered through the office with current State Registration and Insurance Information in order to have and display a current Association Decal.
- All Non-Motorized Boats excluding a paddle board must be registered through the Association and display the appropriate decal.
- Jet Skis and jet powered boats are not permitted to be on the lake. Jet powered boats registered with the Association prior to August 13, 2011 are exempted from this rule.
- All motorized boat traffic must travel in a counter clockwise direction, unless they are fishing and under the power of a trolling motor.
- All boats that are non-motorized have the right of way.
- All fast moving boats are required to stay off the Shoreline by 100 feet.
- All boats pulling tubes, skis, aqua boards or any other object are required to have a spotter. These activities are limited from 9:00 AM until sunset.
- All boats are to have running lights or navigational lights after dusk or before dawn.
- The Association's Special Assistant to the GM is patrolling the Lake and will issue violations as appropriate and the member affected will be required to attend a Compliance Committee Hearing.
- Should you have questions, require clarification, or a copy of these rules please contact the office.

Virginia Boating Safety Class

Section II, Policies, Rules, and Registration; D. Boats requires that all Motorboat Operators complete this class or an equivalent and present proof of Compliance to receive their boating

registration this year, (2017). This policy has been phased in since 2011 and effective July 1, 2016 all operators of motor boats regardless of age, shall meet the requirements. If you have completed this class in another State and have that certificate of completion, it will meet the BRS requirements. An



operator under direct supervision of an individual who has met this requirement is not required to take this class.

The Office cannot issue 2017 registration/decals unless the above requirements are met and a copy of completion is submitted for your file.

Compliance Committee Report

Septic System Inspection

All members are required to have standard septic systems inspected every five years by a certified septic company. Alternative pumping systems must be inspected and or pumped every year. Please submit your certification to the office. This is not only a BRS requirement but a requirement from the Commonwealth of Virginia enforced by all county health departments. The BRS office notifies each member at the beginning of the year when your system is due for inspection. You have until December 31 to comply. Members that do not comply may be fined \$10 per day for 90 days. Our Committee recently took this action on three members and this information may be posted in the Shore Line by name and Street Address. There are no exceptions. This rule is to ensure the health of our lake and the health of our water supply. Thank you for keeping Blue Ridge Shores a healthy community for all.

POSTED SPEED LIMITS

The Association Office receives complaints routinely for people driving throughout the Community and exceeding the posted speed limits. The Louisa County Sheriff's Department has been most helpful in their attempts to resolve this problem. They have jurisdiction to write summons for speeding or reckless driving on Association Roads and the results go into Louisa County General District Court and if found guilty those results will be posted with DMV and appear on your Virginia Driver's License Records.

The Sheriff's Department has assured us of enhanced efforts to resolve these problems and will be placing Deputies in the areas of complaint. Please be considerate of yourself and others as it relates to the potential consequences of traveling too fast within the Community.

REMINDER: All Members and Registered Renters are responsible for their guests and their actions.



Ridge Utilities, Inc. Backflow Prevention Program

Every drinking water system is mandated by the Virginia Department of Health to have a cross-connection/backflow prevention program. RU has a pamphlet outlining our backflow prevention program. Copies can be obtained from the office as well as online at www. ridgeutilities.com. You can also purchase a vacuum breaker from our office to help aid in your own personal backflow prevention.

2nd Quarter 2017 Meter Reading

During the third week of June our Maintenance Department will begin reading meters for the 2nd qtr. of 2017. Please be sure there is nothing obstructing your meter box, such as shrubs, flowers, lawn decorative items, etc. Please do not park vehicles on the meter boxes. You will be responsible for any damage incurred to a meter box if you park a vehicle on it. URGENT Let's Be Proactive and Stop The Spread Of Hydrilla

About 25 years ago, Lake Louisa was invaded by an aquatic grass called Hydrilla. This is a plant originally imported into the U.S. to be used in aquariums and sometimes called "water kudzu" because it grows so fast. Hydrilla became so thick in the lake that many of the coves were unsuitable for swimming or wading and it even became difficult to operate boats in these areas because the hydrilla fouled the propellers so badly. By introducing a type of grass carp that feeds on hydrilla and other underwater vegetation (not the common carp found in most rivers, lakes and ponds) hydrilla has been eliminated from the lake.

While we have not seen any evidence that hydrilla is making a comeback in Lake Louisa, it is definitely making a comeback in Lake Anna and other rivers and lakes in Virginia. We do not want to have a recurrence in our lake. Hydrilla is easily spread by introducing even very small pieces into the water.

Therefore, we are asking that if you use your boat in other lakes or rivers please do the following before putting your boat in our lake.

- 1. Carefully check the boat, motor, propeller, and trailer;
- 2. Remove all plant material;
- 3. Thoroughly rinse off the boat and trailer before launching in Lake Louisa; and
- 4. Do not allow the runoff from this to enter the lake.

More information can be found by doing a simple internet search on "hydrilla in Virginia waters". Your cooperation will help protect the health of our lake.

Thomas Jefferson Soil & Water Conservation District's Septic System Assistance Program

The Thomas Jefferson Soil & Water Conservation District is currently offering



a cost-share assistance program for septic pumpouts or replacement of failing systems to the residents of Louisa County. All residents are eligible to receive up to \$150.00 towards the cost of a septic system pump out. Reimbursement rates for repairs or full replacement

of septic systems range from 50-75% and are based on financial need. The TJSWCD along with the Department of Environmental Quality has developed this cost-sharing program in order to address residential pollutants and to increase septic system awareness.

From The Landscape Committee

There are many gardening chores that can be done now to make your growing season easier. So take advantage of the occasional warm days as winter winds down.

Apply pre-emergent herbicides:

Early spring is a great time to get the first application of pre-emergent herbicide down on their landscape and flower beds. Applying a pre-emergent herbicide can prevent early weed seed from germinating, which saves you from fighting with weeds all season. You may have to reapply the product mid-season for the next series of summer weeds, but the early application will definitely make life easier.

Clear out all fall debris:

It is also a great time to get out and clear away last season's debris that got overlooked in the fall, or those late dropping leaves that didn't fall until after Thanksgiving and then you just didn't feel like raking. Clearing them away now and cleaning up will give your landscaping a fresh, clean look on the warmer spring days to come. Leaving the debris and leaves invites insects and diseases that will cause problems all season. This is especially true when we have warm winter, such as this one.

Consider insecticide treatments:

This is also a good time to look at preventive insecticide treatments for things such as bag worm and lace bug. Many insect problems from last year will appear again this season if they are not addressed.


Much trimming of ornamental trees can also be done before they come out of dormancy. Sometimes it's much easier to see the branching structure of an ornamental tree during the winter and early spring months. This makes it much easier to correctively prune or prune to enhance the natural shape of the plant.

Always use chemicals as directed! Follow all labeling instructions and directions on any chemical used. This is especially important with all of the new information developing about the negative effects of insecticides on the honey bee population. We all want to protect our lake and wildlife and never like to see any of the chemical products overused.

General Manager's Report

We hope you enjoy your summer and look forward to serving the continuing needs of the membership during the summer of 2017. Boat decals may be purchased @ your convenience once you have paid the first half of the 2017 assessments. You cannot purchase gas @ the marina without a current decal. Remember that gas powered motorized boat traffic is only in a counter clock wise direction unless you are fishing and under the power of a trolling motor. Our Special Assistant to the GM will be on the Lake enforcing the boat policies and attempting to maintain a safe environment for all.

Congratulations to Clarence (Smokie) Craig, Paul Glass, and John (Rick) Gray for being re-elected to serve a three year term on the BRPOA Board of Directors. Same wishes to Al Fortune and William Munday for being re-elected to serve on the RU Board for a three year term! We pledge our support to all!

Lake water quality samples were recently taken to the lab in Culpeper to be analyzed. All tests came back well within acceptable ranges for swimming and other related activities. This will be done monthly during the summer-fall season.

We urge members to be considerate of others during your visits to the beach. Please do not leave cigarettes in the sand rather place them in a container and dispose of them properly when you leave. Same rule applies to food and beverages. There are no glass containers or alcohol permitted on the Beaches! Rules of the Beach are posted and we respectfully submit they apply to everyone. More than adequate trash cans are available. Ridge Utilities furnishes water for the bathrooms and outside faucets, so please be considerate and do not let children play in the streams or leave them on once you have cleaned the sand off your feet.

I urge those that wish to sign up for a partial payment agreement to do that soon, in order to avoid higher monthly payments. To date we have approved twenty. We have collected approximately 80 % of the 2017 revenue affiliated with assessments and occupancy fees by the end of April, 2017. There will be a Members Not in Good Standing hearing scheduled in August for those that are making no effort to pay their assessments. The normal collection process will be implemented in the first week of July. The Associations delinquency rate for 2016 was 3%.

Remember nothing can be placed in the Lake including leaves without Board permission. The maintenance employees continue their efforts to mow, paint, and repair/ replace items throughout to make the appearance of the common areas pleasant.

Ridge Utilities is very pleased to announce that all required 2016 testing of the water was completed with a 100% passing of those requirements. The official 2016 Water Quality Report will be distributed soon and if you do not receive one, contact the office for a replacement.

Dredging related activities will begin to occur about the third week of July. Last year there was approximately 31,000 cubic yards of material removed from the Lake and the contractor will remove the remaining 12, 000 cubic yards this summer. This should not have any impact on the summer-lake related activities. There will be no work on the weekends or holidays. The contractor will work a 7:00AM-5:00PM work day. The Spoils Material will be removed through the BRS area road adjacent to Clearwater Lane and hauled across the street for disposal. Please drive slowly in that immediate area.

When you order materials for a project, have your septic system serviced, have LP gas delivered, or order new furniture, it is very important to inform those companies NOT TO CROSS THE DAM AREA! Those vehicles are in excess of the 5 ton limit posted for that area.

Should you witness any activity that appears unlawful contact the Sheriff's Department immediately and also make the office aware of the issue including tag numbers, type of vehicle, and if by chance you know the individual(s).



DID YOU KNOW?

Trees that are dead or have dead limbs are your and your insurance company's responsibility, should they fall and damage a neighbor's property. Live trees that fall during a storm will not be the owner's responsibility.

Please survey your property, talk with your neighbor if necessary, and remove damaged trees and limbs needed.

Please report any trees on association property needing attention that we may have missed.
