# Introduction

Our Family and Social Trendlines bring together in one place the data on family issues. In almost all cases, the data is drawn from original federal government data.

Though the U.S. Census Bureau's annual Statistical Abstract of the United States is a wonderful product, the annual edition does not go back far enough to give the long-term view on most issues. Furthermore the federal data system is rather difficult for the layman (and even for the demographic scholar) to navigate. Through this publication, we hope to remedy this situation and make available data that are not easily accessible for most laymen.

This collection of Trendlines is designed to inform the reader about the American family in its current state, including its behaviors in the five major institutions (five major tasks) of society: family, church, school, marketplace, and government. It is in these institutions that the next generation is born and raised; learns and applies transcendent truths; studies and is taught; where goods and services are produced and traded to meet physical needs; and where society applies physical force when necessary for the common good, the general welfare. We have also included trendline data on health.

This 2014 edition is the second version of our report. We intend hereafter to issue an updated set of Trendlines annually, and we hope that this contribution from the Marriage and Religion Research Institute will be useful for all who are interested in the state of the family and how we as a nation conduct our family life.

These data can be divided into two broad categories. The Trendlines contain fundamentally positive data consisting of conceptions, births, adoptions, and marriages. From these gifts all other demographic goods flow. The fundamentally negative data consist of abortions, separations of parents, divorces, death in its myriad forms, violence, abuse, theft, and addictions, to name but a few.

The Trendlines are divided into nine sections, each devoted to a different set of demographic data: population, reproduction, abortions, family structure, religious practice, educational attainment, income, crimes, and health.

Section one looks at overall **population data** when viewed through different lenses (age, sex, and race/ethnicity).

Section two illustrates **reproduction** through different categories of births, birth rates and fertility rates. It also looks at rates of activities that affect reproduction: sexual activity, conception, and contraception.

Section three deals solely with **abortion** in its different dimensions.

Section four illustrates the different arrangements of the fundamental institution of the **family** in its intactness (marriage and adoption) and its fractured-ness or rearrangements (divorce, single-parent families, and other living arrangements).

Thereafter, in sections five, six, seven, and eight, the Report looks at the other basic institutions of **religious practice**, educational attainment, income, and crime.

Section nine, the last section, looks at health and mental health.

We look forward to providing you with an updated and expanded version of this report in the future.

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
Editor's Notes:

- In some charts organized by specified race/ethnicity, due to the organization of U.S. Census racial categories, Hispanic individuals are represented twice: first, by their ethnicity, on the "Hispanic" trendline, and second, by their race, usually on the "Black" or "White" trendlines. This is because the U.S. Census Bureau considers "Hispanic" to be an ethnic, not a racial, category.
- The murders and non-negligent homicides that occurred as a result of the events of September 11, 2001, are not included in the charts tracking murder and non-negligent homicide numbers and rates.




# U.S. Index of Family Belonging and Rejection by Race/Ethnicity 2008-2011





# U.S. Index of Family Belonging and Rejection by State 2008-2011 Source: American Community Survey






# Population of the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1940-2011






# Asian Population of the U.S. 1990-2011




# U.S. Pregnancy Rate of Married and Unmarried Women by Race/Ethnicity 1993-2008






# Live Births in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1950-2011

# U.S. Birth Rate by Race/Ethnicity 1950-2010









Total Pregnancies, Live Births, Abortions, and Miscarriages in the U.S. 1976-2010\*




Total Pregnancies and Live Births in the U.S. 1976-2010




Total Pregnancies and Abortions in the U.S. 1976-2008






### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married Women 1990-2008




### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Unmarried Women 1990-2008




# U.S. Pregnancy Rate of Married and Unmarried Women by Race/Ethnicity 1993-2008




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married White Women 1990-2008




### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Unmarried White Women 1990-2008








## U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married Hispanic Women 1993-2008








## Live Births in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1950-2011




## U.S. Birth Rate by Race/Ethnicity 1950-2010



Total Pregnancies, Live Births, Abortions, and Miscarriages in the U.S. 1976-2010\*






# Births to Minors\* as a Percentage of All Births in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1970-2010




### Out-of-Wedlock Births as a Percentage of All Births in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1975-2011






# U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate by Age of Mother 1970-2011 Source: NCHS, National Vital Statistics Reports




U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate by Race/Ethnicity 1980-2011




# U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate of Teenage Women by Race/Ethnicity 1980-2011




# U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate of Women Aged 20-24 by Race/Ethnicity 1980-2011




U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate of White Mothers by Age 1980-2011








U.S. Out-of-Wedlock Birth Rate of Black Mothers by Age 1980-2011









### High School Students in the U.S. Who Have Had Sexual Intercourse by Grade (Selected Years) 1991-2011










#### Women Aged 15-44 in the U.S. Currently Using Specified Contraceptive Method (Selected Years) 1982-2008















#### Women Childless in the U.S. by Age (Selected Years) 1976-2010






Total Pregnancies, Live Births, Abortions, and Miscarriages in the U.S. 1976-2010\*




Total Pregnancies and Abortions in the U.S. 1976-2008




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married Women 1990-2008




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Unmarried Women 1990-2008

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




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Unmarried White Women 1990-2008




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married Black Women 1993-2008




#### U.S. Pregnancy, Live Birth, Abortion, and Miscarriage Rates of Married Hispanic Women 1993-2008















## Persons Aged 15+ in the U.S. No Longer with Their Partner 1999-2011


## Males Aged 15+ in the U.S. No Longer with Their Partner 1999-2011




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#### Females Aged 15+ in the U.S. No Longer with Their Partner 1999-2011




# Family Structure: Children, by General Family Structure


#### Minor Children in the U.S. in Mother-Only Households 1968-2012




### Number of Children in the U.S. Living with Grandparents 1970-2013














# Children Adopted through Public Agencies in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1998-2012





### Ever- and Never-Married Women in the U.S. by Number of Children Ever Born 1995-2010





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



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

#### Marital Status of Male Population Aged 14+ in the U.S. 1953-2010\*





#### Men Aged 14+ Currently Married in the U.S. by Age 1953-2010\*








### Marital Status of Female Population Aged 14+ in the U.S. 1953-2010\*





## Women Aged 14+ Currently Married by Age in the U.S. 1953-2010\*





## Divorces in the U.S. 1940-2011\*






#### Men Aged 18+ Currently Divorced in the U.S. by Age 1953-2010\*






### Women Currently Divorced in the U.S. 1950-2010\*



### Marriage, Remarriage, and Divorce History of Black Men Aged 15+ in the U.S. (Selected Years) 1996-2009








Marriage, Remarriage, and Divorce History of Hispanic Women Aged 15+ in the U.S. (Selected Years) 1996-2009

## Frequency of Religious Service Attendance in the U.S. (Selected Years) 1972-2010













Educational Attainment in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity 1964-2012











## Hispanic Children Aged 6-18 in the U.S. by Paternal Educational Attainment (Selected Years) 1974-2010

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






## Median Family Income in the U.S. by Family Type in Constant (2012) Dollars




### Median Family Income in the U.S. by Married Family Type in Constant (2012) Dollars 1947-2012




## Median Family Income in the U.S. by Race/Ethnicity in Constant (2012) Dollars 1947-2012


## Median Individual Income in the U.S. by Sex in Constant (2012) Dollars 1947-2012


#### U.S. Violent Crime Rate 1992-2011

#### U.S. Forcible Rape\* Rate 1960-2011





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





## Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, and Syphilis Cases in Persons Aged 15-24 in the U.S. 1990-2010






## New Male HIV Diagnoses in the U.S. by Transmission Category 1999-2010




## New Female HIV Diagnoses in the U.S. by Transmission Category 1999-2010




#### U.S. Suicide Rate by Sex 1980-2010










