

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

FATHERHOOD: NOT FOR THE FAINTHEARTED

As priests, sometimes we sort of wonder how things would have been if we were real fathers - married with kids and all. Some of us sometimes miss the experience. However, while I don't know about priests from other countries and



cultures, I do know that those of us from Nigeria are heavily involved in our families, far more than people realize. My niece (brother's daughter) asked me several times, the last time very recently, if she could call me 'dad'. She was dead serious about it and tried hard to convince

me. Oh, she's 17 going on 18. And we've come a long way since their dad died three years ago. Her brother is 14 now. Recently he recognized a financial need in the family and told me he wants to contribute from his meager pocket money. I was so proud of him.

While I never really experienced what it means to have your biological father beside you and learn from him, God does find many ways to make up for what we miss in life. We just have to pay attention. So, he placed in my life a good uncle. Without knowing it, I learned a few vital lessons from him on what fathers are all about. From my 20 years in the ministry, I've also observed and learned what exemplary fathers do. Notice that I didn't say perfect, but exemplary.

From all the bits and pieces of experiences I've had and witnessed, exemplary fathers share some simple but fine, and often hard to acquire habits.

Strength is one. When my brother died, my sisters advised me not to come home, fearing that some harm might come to me too. I knew they were also afraid and in panic mode, not to talk of confusion and stress. Against their wish, I went home and I was glad I did. I'm the only male figure in my immediate family right now and I knew they needed one right then. I believe that God has endowed each sex with great and unique strengths and capabilities. Yes, mothers (single mothers especially) can provide strength for the family but fathers are equipped to do it in a very natural way also. It's like going down into the basement at night, with all the spiders and other crawly creatures. Fathers might be afraid too, but they seem to be able to feign bravado and go there. Exemplary fathers bring strength to their family, especially to their kids.

I've come a long way with my family, especially with those two - just being there, knowing when to lead and when to support. I know many fathers have done much more, since that's their natural turf. So, exemplary fathers know when to lead and when to support. This is one of the aspects that we lack in our families nowadays. We have fathers who are at a loss on how to lead or worse, who lead their families (especially their kids) astray by their words and examples. We have fathers who not only don't support their families and kids but end up undermining them

As we celebrate our Fathers today, we pray for more exemplary fathers. We pray for those who are living and showing good examples to their kids and helping them on their way to becoming responsible adults and fathers. Sadly, our society is tending towards thinking that fathers are expendable. We must resist this. Mothers are indispensable and fathers are in their own unique ways indispensable.

In the gospel (Luke 9:18-24), Jesus tells us, especially fathers, that if anyone wishes to come after him, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Him. He says that whoever wishes to save his life will eventually lose it, but whoever loses his life for His sake will save it.

The vocation to fatherhood is not about you the father, but really about your kids and your family. It's about dying to yourself so that your family might live. And rather than see this as a loss, to

succeed, you must see it as the only true way to Life.
