Parents Code of Conduct -Bill Meyer League

Every Parent and Spectator is Expected to:

- 1. Learn and respect the rules of soccer and Bill Meyer League (BML)
- 2. Show respect and courtesy to game officials, coaches, spectators, and players at all times.
- 3. Respect the game officials and refrain from commenting and/or questioning their decisions or from addressing them in a loud, disrespectful or abusive manner and/or directing others to before, during or after the game.
- 4. Cheer for your child's team in a positive manner, refraining at all times from making negative or abusive remarks about the opposing team. Maintain control of your emotions, those who attend on your behalf or accompany you to the game and avoid actions, language, and/or gestures that may be interpreted as hostile and/or humiliating.
- 5. Ensure your child is at all practices and games at the required time or advise the coach beforehand.
- Obey all rules of the fields, parks, schools or leagues at which games or practice is held. NO DOGS/PETS, NO ALCOHOL/TOBACCO PRODUCTS, or NO NOISEMAKERS of Any kind.
- 7. During the game I will remain on the side of the field designated for my child's team.
- 8. I understand Bill Meyer is a winter play league which means play may be restricted due to weather, games and or practices may be cancelled (if the opportunity arises to reschedule with district/league approval game may be held/made-up). There is NO guarantee to the numbers of games to be played.
- 9. I understand this is a travel league and therefore agree to provide the opportunity for my child to play at other out of town locations. Bill Meyer game locations vary week to week and may be played anywhere in the District 8 boundaries.
- 10. I will obey all requests or decisions made by any league official or board representative contingent to the day of play.
- 11. Parents serve as role models for their children. Applaud good plays by your child's team as well as good plays by the opposing team.
- 12. Don't be a sideline coach or referee. Remember your child is the one playing soccer, not you. Allow them to establish their own goals to play the game for themselves.
