Salaries & Current Expenses

Salaries and current expenses are the "Home" expenses. They include salaries for pastor, secretary and custodian, church and parsonage maintenance and upkeep, utilities, insurance, worship supplies etc.

Missions

Mission expenses are the dollars we send to Iowa District West, Camp Okoboji and Lutheran Family Services.

If you do not indicate your choice, your contribution will go to the GeneralFund.

Special Offering Envelopes go to Missions – they include: Reformation, Advent, Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Lent Services, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Pentecost, and Thanksgiving. The Children's Christmas Program contributions goes to the Sunday School Department and the Candlelight Service contributions goes to the youth. All loose plate offerings go to Missions on the above holidays.

Special Offering such as Building Fund, Lutheran Witness etc. go to the fund marked on the envelope.

You <u>must</u> use <u>your current year's numbered envelope if you want your contribution recorded for your statements</u>. If you have any questions, please call the office for clarification.

Stewards Living with Purpose

In the book of Psalms, King David wrote, "The Lord will fulfill His purpose for me" (Psalm 138:8). In spite of David's sinful life and the difficulties he had with Saul and Absalom, the Lord fulfilled His purpose for David. Just as God had a purpose for David, so He has for us as well. Have you given much thought to what purpose God may have for your life? By grace, we understand that we were created for God's purpose, not ours.

One important purpose God gives His people is to care for His creation and His people. We are given the honor to be His stewards. Stewards care for all that God entrusts to us according to His will. As His stewards, we understand that He is the creator and owner of all things. When we responsibly care for the earth and provide for His people both physically and spiritually, we honor God as His stewards.

God's Word reminds us that by nature we are sinful fallen people who are spiritually dead and unable to accomplish the purpose that God has designed us to do. The Apostle Paul tells us that "We once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us...made us alive together with Christ..." (Ephesians 2:3-5). The only way we can do anything to please Him and to live with a God-pleasing purpose is to be recreated by the Holy Spirit and to be converted into new people in Christ (2 Corinthians 5).

As people of faith, our purpose is not to live for ourselves but for Jesus Who "died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for Him Who for their sake died and was raised" (2 Corinthians 5:15). In our lives as stewards, we can, with God's help, put Him first in all things. "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31). When we serve, let us serve "by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 4:11).

Thomas Carlyle, an historian and author, wrote, "The man without a purpose is like a ship without a rudder—a waif, a nothing a no man." We need purpose in order to have meaning for our lives. We are blessed because in Christ we have purpose for living. May we all thank God that He has given us faith and wisdom to understand that our purpose in life is to give Him glory, honor, and service.

From Pastor's Desk

Several years ago, a seminary friend of mine, now a pastor in Texas, began writing notes on Facebook to whoever reads them. He signed each one "a concerned Pastor." Those notes come from the heart of a man who desires people to have the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ while still walking in a world of distraction, confusion, busyness, sickness and death. It's hard sometimes, despite preaching for a living, for pastors to convey to their congregation exactly what his concerns are for fear people will be upset, misunderstand, or ignore the words he says. So, I'd like to take the opportunity in the next several newsletter articles to write some of my "concerns" to you. Know that Jesus loves you, that's most important, and He wants you to have everything He has. Know that I love you very much. Sometimes saying hard things needs to happen for us to grow and move forward. Know that whatever I say comes from a concerned heart and always out of love. If you are confused, concerned, or even upset by what I say, come talk to me.

Dear members of Trinity, I am concerned that our worship attendance is dropping. Each Saturday night and Sunday morning I come hoping that our sanctuary will be full of people who want to receive the gifts of Jesus. That's what worship is about-receiving Jesus' gifts and responding to Him with thanks and praise. God has commanded us to "Remember the Sabbath Day" and He means it. This means coming to church to gather together to "gladly hear and learn" the Word of God. I'm concerned that it's so easy for you not to come or that you're filling your lives with the wrong things. I am concerned that you're letting work, busyness, other activities, and even laziness replace your "hearing and learning" together as God's people. And this puts you in a danger of rejecting the gifts of Jesus. True, our calendars fill up fast and there's always lots going on, but you make the choices for your families. No one makes it for you. You are responsible. We also go to church to encourage each other in our walk with Jesus through this life. ESV **Hebrews 10:24** And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. The day of Jesus' return is drawing near, and we need what He gives. We need what we share together as a family of believers.

Some of you, of course, will read this and say, "I'd like to be there, but..." I'm not talking about if you're sick or elderly or concerned about the weather. I'm more concerned if you're not coming for some other reason. We've attempted to broadcast services online, these are helpful for sharing with those who can't be there, but the Lord wants us to meet together in person. Online worship is not meant to replace being there in person. As Lutherans, we believe the Lord is present with us in worship- it's His Divine Service. It's especially important for Jesus that we receive His Word together with our fellow Christians and for us to receive His body and blood in His Supper. "Do this..." is His Word. Jesus wants you to have it. If you can't be there because of illness, physical challenges, etc., to arrange me to bring communion to you.

Again, the Lord loves you, and I love you. In the new calendar year consider the importance of being in worship weekly for your eternal good and the good of your family in Jesus. You need to do something five times to make it a habit. This is a good habit. This needs to be a concern that all of us at Trinity have for each other. Each of us matter to the Lord and each of us need to matter to one another. Consider how you can encourage your fellow members to be active in worship and how important it is for you. 
