


Student Data

- 2. Places to go and recreation in the community that don't cost money
- Opportunities for on the job training/mentoring and positive relationships with adults in the community



Responses collected during an unstructured conversation about what students need in order to achieve educational excellence.

- 1. Opportunities to explore areas of personal interest in school and in the community
- 2. Access to mental health care
- 3. Job shadowing/mentoring /volunteering opportunities with positive adult role models in the community
- 4. Affordable recreation activities
- 5. Supportive parents and positive school/family relationships
- 6. Academic support for struggling students starting in elementary school
- 7. Programs to support basic needs of low income students
- 8. Removal of language barriers and cliques by ethnic groups
- 9. **Transportation** to engage in the community
- 10. College credit in HS and college scholarships






Riverland Community College Student Focus Groups ≈ 40 students

- 1. Supportive adults and mentors to navigate the world of post-secondary education
- 2. To discover our areas of interest and have opportunities to explore these interests
- 3. Financial support for post-secondary education
- 4. College prep classes, job shadowing and real life experiences while in high school
- 5. Transportation to and from Riverland
- 6. Opportunities to volunteer in the community
- 7. Support in balancing attending school and raising a family
- 8. To develop independence and life skills before heading to college

- 1. PSEO, Honors, and AP classes were best **preparation** for post-secondary coursework
