


BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP:

PARISH HISTORY



No one was paid for anything, not even the live in housekeeper. And I remember carrying a mattress on my back. Charley Nye donated his bedroom suite when he built his house on Orange Street. Edmund Hunter moved the pastors in with a truck. We all pulled together to get the Parish going......."

Sunday of the Word of God January 26, 2020

Recalling the importance placed on the Word of God at the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis has established the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as "The Sunday of the Word of God."

All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3; 16-17)

"These divinely revealed realities which are contained and presented in sacred Scripture have been committed to writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Holy Mother Church, relying on the belief of the apostles, holds that the books of both the Old and New Testament in their entirety, with all their parts, are sacred and canonical because, having been written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author and have been handed on as such to the Church herself."
