Douglas County WIC Announces Updated Income Guidelines

The Douglas County Health Department WIC announces the release of the updated income guidelines. The income guidelines are based on 185% of the federal poverty income guidelines issued by the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). DHHS releases annual adjustments to the poverty income guidelines before June each year.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) is a special supplemental nutrition program providing services to pregnant women, new mothers, infants and children up to their 5th birthday based on nutritional risk and income eligibility. The primary services provided are healthy, supplemental food, risk assessment, nutrition education and counseling, breastfeeding promotion and support, health screening and referrals to health care. To be eligible for WIC, applicants must have an income of less than or equal to 185% of the poverty level and be at nutritional risk. Migrant families are also eligible.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) participants and MO HealthNet participants of income-qualifying MO HealthNet programs are automatically eligible for WIC benefits. The income guidelines below reflect gross (pre-tax) income, and a pregnant woman may count as two family members. To view the complete list broken out by family size, visit WIC.Mo.Gov. WIC is administered in Douglas County by the Douglas County Health Department. Ingredients:

1 pkg. 16 oz. spaghetti

1 1/2 lbs. ground beef

1 medium onion, chopped

1/2 cup chopped green pepper

1 can (10 $\frac{3}{4}$ oz.) condensed tomato

soup

2 or 3 cans tomato sauce (can also use part tomato paste)

1 cup water

2 tbsp. brown sugar or Splenda

t tsp. salt & pepper or to taste

1 tsp. basil

1 tsp. oregano

1/2 tsp. dried rosemary (crushed)

1/2 tsp. garlic salt

1 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella

cheese



Break spaghetti. Cook according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a Dutch oven, cook the beef, onion, and green pepper over medium heat until no longer pink. Drain. Stir in soup, tomato sauce, water, brown sugar, and seasonings. Drain spaghetti. Stir into meat sauce. Add ½ cup of cheese. Transfer to greased 13x9x2 inch pan. Cover and bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Uncover. Sprinkle with remaining ½ cup of cheese. Bake 10-15 minutes longer or until cheese is melted.


