

From 'The Present"

By Billy Collins Much has been said about being in the present. It's the place to be, according to the gurus, like the latest club on the downtown scene, but no one, it seems, is able to give you directions. It doesn't seem desirable or even possible to wake up every morning and begin leaping from one second into the next until you fall exhausted back into bed. Plus, there'd be no past with so many scenes to savor and regret, and no future, the place you will die.....The trouble with the present is that it's always in a state of vanishing. Take the second it takes to end this sentence with a period-already gone. What about the moment that exists between banging your thumb with a hammer and realizing you are in a whole lot of pain? What about the one that occurs after you hear the punch line but before you get the joke? Is that where the wise men want us to live in that intervening tick, the tiny slot searching downtown for that new club and just before you give up and head back home?

A Rabbi was asked by his son, "With what do you pray?" Rabbi said, "With the floor and with the chair." This is no metaphor. It is now meant quite directly; in praying the rabbi joins himself to the floor on which he stands and the chair on which he sits - the things that are, to be sure, made by human hands, yet like all things, they have their origin from God, and they help him to pray. And he helps them to pray, indeed; he raises them, the wooden floor and wooden chair, to their origin. He elevates them by prayer....."

Mark 9:2-10

The best is yet to come! What glory lies ahead for us! I like to remind myself every Lent, that the first Sunday gospel is the Temptation story of Jesus, and the second Sunday is always the Transfiguration story of Jesus. The first Sunday realistically shows us what we are up against! The devil does not want us grow closer to the God, or for any holiness to increase in the world (the devil is always ready to knock us out of grace-count on it!) So, after having us brace for challenge on the first Sunday, this second Sunday's gospel gives us a pep-rally preview of glory to come if we stick with our work of discipleship to Christ. Jesus goes to the desert to prepare, even for going to the cross. But it all leads to the resurrection in the end! So the vision of the Transfiguration is our boost along the ridge to propel us onward to the summit!

I find the vision of the Transfiguration to be an advance glimpse of the Resurrection. Exaltation, Glory & Holy Company. Jesus radiant in light, lifted up high and surrounded by fellow witnesses (in the Transfiguration scene, it is the OT Greats of Moses & Elijah!) Why Moses & Elijah? I find several reasons why to apply. Maybe it could have been David and Jeremiah (I'm no judge of OT sanctity but it seems like David & Jeremiah have a few more skeletons in their closet than God's chosen two of Moses & Elijah – but if I was picking, Ezekiel might be closer in the running, because he knows what to do with 'skeletons' – Prophesy to them and raise them up, marching them farther out of view - Ezekiel 37:1-14) But really, Moses and Elijah traditionally have been figureheads for what the Hebrews called God's Revealed Word – the 'Law & Prophets'. Of course, Moses the teacher received the Law on Mt Sinai (Exodus 24:12-18) and Elijah the wonderworker, performed miracles such as multiplying flour & oil, causing rain to stop and start, calling fire from heaven, raise a dead boy etc (1 Kings 17-19). Yet, also similar to Jesus' 40-day stay in the desert, both Moses and Elijah have extended 40-day wilderness periods of contact with God (Moses in Ex 34:28, Elijah in1 Kgs 19:8). Yet, I find Moses and Elijah to also be blessed with promised resurrection suggestions. Elijah most clearly because he is simply assumed into heaven, to await an earthly return (2 Kings 2:11) and with Moses while we hear about a passing, we are cryptically told in Deuteronomy 34:6 "no one knows the place of his burial." If we don't know, then is he still around? They are obviously alive to Jesus, Peter, James and John in this encounter, so they are blessed with some grace of 'resurrected eternal life'. So, Moses and Elijah are the best of company for Jesus, because the OT Law and Prophets wonderfully introduce Jesus, and then with Jesus' coming, He perfectly fulfills and surpasses them! Jesus says about Moses, in John 5:46 "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, because he wrote about me" and about Elijah, in Matthew 11:14 "if you are willing to accept it, John (Baptist) is Elijah, the one who is to come." So, the transfiguration is not the first time that Moses, Elijah and Jesus have conferenced! But to summarize, Moses and Elijah are the 'greats' of the Old Testament, and they are here to Jesus' right and left, like on the Olympic Platform, and their presence celebrates Jesus' status as their fulfillment!

As we move into this intense period of growth in faith and holiness (40-day period of focused closeness to God), that we call Lent, I hope that we can converse with Peter, James, John, Moses, Elijah, and of course, in the center of it all, Jesus! Maybe as a special prayer activity, we can select one event from each of their lives for each regular week of Lent to reflect on in our study. (There are five regular weeks of Lent and then we can reserve Holy Week leading into Easter for Jesus alone!) Or just any one of them would bear good prayer fruit, if we read closely about their lives. Or any additional reading of scripture, (gospels, psalms, etc?) would benefit our experience of Lent as a time of change and transformation for good. Or take on a social service project serving someone less fortunate. Or sacrifice and offer up some pleasure or treat to free yourself to be of greater help to someone who needs it. Lent offers us many ways to grow closer to God and increase our experience of His grace. Peace, Fr Brian
