MINUTES: of the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 15th November 2021 at

7.00 pm.

IN ATTENDANCE: Maxi Freeman, Clerk.

- 1) Call to order. The Chairman called the meeting to order.
- 2) Apologies for absence. Received in advance from Cllr Bell.
- 3) Declarations of Interest in items on the Agenda. (Localism Act 2011). None.
- 4) To hear representations from the public regarding items on the Agenda. None.
- 5) Approval of minutes of the previous meeting (July 2021) The meeting approved the minutes and the Chairman signed them. Action: Clerk to post to website.
- 6) Matters Arising (Clerk's Report and report from Chairman).
 - * The Chairman reported that she had met Max Kelly of GCC Highways to discuss problem drainage areas in the village. Mr Kelly informed the Chairman that the window for the Community Maintenance Scheme had closed for the current year, and that the work at the Mill Race had been scheduled but the contractors had rejected the work as they did not think it was Highways' responsibility. (However, he was going to look into it.)
 - * Mr Kelly recommended that residents and councillors report any blockages using the 'Report-It' page on the GCC Highways website.
 - * The Chairman and Cllr Bell had attended a CDC forum about council budgeting, which encouraged PCs to increase their precepts requests to include any known future requirements.
 - * The Chairman reported that the 1000 whips requested for planting between the quarry and Summerhill would be arriving shortly, though no date was provided. Breedon had confirmed that it would engage contractors to carry out the planting.

7) Planning applications

a. To decide on the process for approving planning application with deadlines between meetings:

Councillors noted that there were a large number of planning applications every month and that it was not feasible to hold a meeting for each of them. The following were agreed:

- * Authority is delegated to the clerk to comment 'Support' for any TCONR applications for tree trimming only.
- * TCONR applications to fell trees to continue to be referred to a meeting of the parish councillors.
- * The planning application item on agendas to be shown as 'Councillors to consider planning applications received since the previous meeting and any received between the date of issue of the agenda and the meeting'.
- * Where necessary, the Clerk shall request CDC to grant an extension of the deadline for planning comments to enable applications to be considered at the next NPC meeting.

b. To consider the following planning applications:

<u>21/04087/TCONR</u> Conifer tree - fell because of low amenity value. Replant with yew hedge Whiteladies 4 Village Avenue Naunton Cheltenham Gloucestershire GL54 3AS. Councillors had no objections to this application. Action: Clerk to post to CDC planning portal.

<u>21/04174/FUL</u> Further application for Ben Pauling race yard, Naunton Golf Course for approval of changes to permitted buildings. Councillors had no objections to the application, noting that the changes were internal. Action: Clerk to post to planning portal.



<u>21/03766/TCONR</u> Trim 5 trees at St Andrews Church Naunton Gloucestershire. Note: received since agenda was published. Councillors had no objection to this application. Action: Clerk to post to CDC planning portal.

c. Councillors confirmed that the comments posted for applications received in between meetings were correct:

<u>21/03260/FUL</u> Ben Pauling race yard, Naunton Golf Course. Changes to the foul drainage system proposed in permitted application <u>21/01066/FUL</u>. Supported.

<u>21/03216/FUL</u> Brockhill Farm. Demolition of existing dwelling and equestrian buildings and erection of a replacement dwelling and ancillary buildings, with associated landscaping and access alterations. No objections.

21/03380/FUL Erection of two-storey extensions to side and rear and lean-to extension to front. Whiteladies, 4 Village Avenue, Naunton. Councillors supported this application.
21/03577/FUL Naunton Golf Club. Formation of raised tee (retrospective). Councillors supported this application. Since permitted.

<u>21/03549/TCONR</u> Mill Barn, Naunton GL54 3AD. Fell maple to ground as it has become very large and is in close proximity to the house. 'Neutral' comment posted, noting preference for pruning rather than felling. Awaiting decision.

8) Assets and risk assessment

<u>a.</u> Recreation field Cllr Bell had informed councillors in his absence that the final clear up after the bonfire would take place on Wednesday. More dog bags were being used and the budget for 22/23 should allocate more funds to this item.

Cllr Bell also noted that new pads would be needed in December 2022 as well as replacement pads and that the budget should factor these in at £39 + P&P and VAT. Action: Clerk to include in budget. Clerk to source cheaper bags if possible.

- <u>b. Play area</u> Cllr Hanks reported that £31,000 had been raised excluding a donation from NPC. Most had been collected. The work was 65% complete and should be finished in appx 1 month. The application form for the £2000 grant from the Gloucestershire Playing Field Association was signed. Cllr Hanks proposed that an opening event be held in Spring and Councillors agreed to this proposal. The Chairman thanked everyone involved in making the project a success, especially Cllr Hanks. Action: Clerk to send form to GPFA.
- c. Flood monitoring Cllr Russell informed that the river had been cleared and was running well. However, there were still some trees hanging low over the river. Action: Cllr Russell to ask riparian owners to clear these overhanging trees. Councillors agreed that the problem of flooding was due mainly to surface water and that the gullies and drains needed to be kept clear. Councillors agreed that individuals close to any blocked drains and gullies should clear them. If there are any urgent or emergency blockages residents should report them to GCC Highways on the 'Report- It' web page as suggested under minute 6 above. Action: Clerk to write copy for the next Naunton Newsletter.
- <u>d. Village Hall</u> Cllr Chance informed the meeting that the VH committee AGM had been held on 20th October but she had not been able to attend. Due to illness, the Treasurer had not attended or provided the financial report for the year yet. Cllr Chance also noted that the village hall was busy and that the kitchen fan and electrics box on the stage had been renewed.

9) Finances.

<u>a. Current account and reconciliation</u>. Cllrs noted the current financial records and the reconciliation. The Chairman then signed the reconciliation.

<u>b. Income and expenditure</u> for the Recreation Ground was noted.
