Dear Friends,

Happy New Year!

Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. As always, I hope this message finds you in good health, rejoicing in the joy of the Lord, and continuing to grow in your knowledge of godliness.

Christians, like many others, are beginning to make new year's resolutions, those well-intended strategies for developing or enhancing areas of our lives. Many will plan to improve their physical, emotional, and spiritual health. Others will commit to working diligently to be more present in the lives of those who love them. Some will pledge to curtail their spending and get their finances in order. Others will promise to grow their faith by engaging more regularly in the spiritual disciplines – praying, studying Scripture, attending worship service, fasting, and doing charitable works. Others will pull out their fancy daily planners from previous years and determine to bring the plans previously made to fruition.

Whatever your thoughts for making changes during the new year, consider beginning with Proverbs 3: 5-6, "*Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not depend on your own understanding. And in all your ways acknowledge God, and God will make your paths straight.*"

Pick a day during the first week of the new year to read and meditate on the passage. Begin by asking God to help you apply his word to your life. Then read the passage three times (you may find it helpful to read it in three different translations). Underline, highlight or jot down the phrases that you found particularly meaningful.

Then, pray about your new year's resolutions. Try whittling your list down to one or two things. Once you have done that, ask God to help you develop realistic strategies to achieve the goals of your resolutions. End with prayer by thanking God for the reassurance that he will help you accomplish your goals.

Each day review your resolutions and the strategies for fulfilling them. If you miss a day or fail to complete a task, start over, knowing God cares for you (1 Peter 5:7) and will help you get back on track.

Now, let me update you on the UPC Helping Homeless Families Initiative (HHFI). Praise God: we achieved the mission goals through the generous donations and support of members and friends. The last component of the 2022 initiative, Gifts for Girls, was completed on December 21, with a youth group member delivering the gifts to the shelter.

Well, friends, that is all for now. May the peace of Christ rule our hearts and strengthen us to run the good race that glorifies God through our good works until Christ calls us home.



## EPIPHANY

January 6, 2023

Liturgical colors: White & Gold—Epiphany 12 days from Christmas (12 days) to (Jan. 6).

'Epiphany' comes from the Greek word meaning 'to reveal' or 'manifest', as it is when the baby Jesus was 'revealed' or 'manifested' to the world. This is why you might hear people say they've had an epiphany, when they've just realized something.

Epiphany, also called Feast of the Epiphany, Theophany, or Three

Kings' Day is a Christian holiday commemorating the first manifestation or revelation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi, and the manifestation of his divinity, as it occurred at his baptism in the Jordan River and at his first miracle, at Cana in Galilee. Epiphany is one of the three principal and oldest festival days of the Christian church. The other two are Easter and Christmas.

Epiphany is celebrated 12 days after Christmas on 6th January (or January 19th for some Orthodox Church who have Christmas on 7th January) and is the time when Christians remember the Wise Men (also sometimes called the Three Kings) who visited Jesus.

*The epiphany feast completes the season of Christmas by inviting us to discern the identity of the Christ child.* Epiphany is also when some Churches remember when Jesus was Baptized, when he was about 30, and started to teach people about God. The visit of the Wise Men and his Baptism are important times when Jesus was 'revealed' to be very important.

Epiphany Eve (also known as Twelfth Night) marks the end of the traditional Christmas celebrations and is the time when you were meant to take Christmas decorations down.

## **BAPTISM OF JESUS**

January 8, 2023

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is observed annually on the Sunday after January 6. It commemorates the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist.

Matthew 3:13-17: <sup>13</sup> Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. <sup>14</sup> But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?"..... <sup>16</sup> As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. <sup>17</sup> And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."


In Christian theology, a baptism is a kind of rebirth; a washing away of original sin and a purification of the soul. According to the Bible, the first known baptism occurred with Jesus, sometime around 30 AD, when he was baptized in the River Jordan by his disciple John later known as John the Baptist.

Jesus tells John that His baptism is "fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness". Jesus is baptized as a symbol of giving His will up to His Father and the beginning of His earthly ministry. God affirmed Jesus' baptism in a powerful way: As soon as Jesus was baptized and

came up out of the water, the heavens opened. John sees the Spirit of God descending like a dove upon Jesus and they hear God's voice say "This is my Son, the beloved, whom I have approved." The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus following his baptism. This was a sign that Jesus' ministry was empowered by the Spirit and would usher in peace between humankind and God.

Jesus didn't need to repent or turn from sin, rather, his baptism served as a sign that he was the Messiah. Jesus' baptism account is a beautiful portrayal of the loving union of the Trinity – Father, Son, and Spirit. This moment in his life marked the beginning of his ministry in which he was partaking in the human experience fully as the spotless lamb of God sent to save the world.

## Martin Luther King Day 2023 January 16, 2023

"Why should there be hunger and deprivation in any land, in any city, at any table, when man has the esources and the scientific know-how to provide mankind with the basic necessities of life?" Martin Luther King Jr

This observance day commemorates the January 15, 1929, birth of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. King was a civil rights leader, minister, and winner of the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize. He was born in Atlanta, Georgia and was assassinated April 4, 1968.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is a United States holiday marking his birth and observed on the third Monday of January each year. It is one of four United States federal holidays to commemorate an individual person.

King was the chief spokesman for nonviolent activism in the civil rights movement, which successfully protested racial discrimination in federal and state law.

The campaign for a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination. Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed in 1986. At first, some states resisted observing the holiday as such, giving it alternative names or combining it with other holidays. It was officially observed in all 50 states for the first time in 2000.

One place where this day is observed as important is in the Japanese city of Hiroshima under mayor Tadatoshi Akiba, who holds a special banquet at the mayor's office as an act of unifying his city's call for peace with King's message of human rights. (From: Wikipedia, license: CCA-SA)

## "Do good; seek justice."

Week of Prayer for **Christian Unity** 

January 18-25, 2023

The theme is from Isaiah 1:17. "Do good; seek justice." The entire scriptural passage for the theme is Isaiah 1:12-18, lamenting a lack of justice among the People of God. Yet, it also promises redemption by encour-



aging acts of justice.

The 2023 theme was developed with the assistance of a group of Christians in Minnesota, USA, convened by the Minnesota Council of Churches. Minneapolis, MN became a flashpoint for calls for racial justice and equity during the responses of communities to the George Floyd murder. This received world-wide attention.

## "Today, separation and oppression continue to be manifest ...."

In its *Introduction to the Theme*, the organizers write: "Today, separation and oppression continue to be manifest when any single group or class is given privileges above others. The sin of racism is evident in any beliefs or practices that distinguish or elevate one "race" over another. When accompanied or sustained by imbalances in power, racial prejudice moves beyond individual relationships to the very structures of society - the systemic perpetuation of racism. Its existence has unfairly benefitted some, including churches, and burdened and excluded others, simply due to the color of their skin and the cultural associations based upon perceptions of 'race'."

Calling to mind our common Christian commitment to justice and mercy, we pray that the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, January 18-25, 2023 will be full of moments of conversion of heart through our ecumenical encounters, so that "all may be one."





# Angels Watching Over Me

Theme:God's protection.Object:A Bible

Scripture: Matthew 2:12-23

Children's Sermon: Angels Watching Over Me (Matthew 2:12-23)

Have you ever heard the song, "Angels Watching Over Me?" It is a beautiful Black Spiritual which tells about how God sends his angels to watch over us. No one knows who wrote the song, but it is believed to have originated in the southern part of the United States during the days of slavery. The song goes like this: (Sing it, if possible.)

All night, all day, Angels watching over me, my Lord. All night, all day, Angels watching over me. Sun is a-setting in the west; Angels watching over me, my Lord. Sleep my child, take your rest; Angels watching over me.

When Jesus was born, Herod was King. When he heard about the birth of Jesus, he thought that Jesus had come to set up a kingdom here on earth and he was not at all happy about that. He tried to find out where Jesus was so that he could kill him. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and warned him of the danger. "Get up! Flee to Egypt with the child and his mother," the angel said. "Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." That night Joseph left for Egypt with Jesus and Mary. They stayed there until Herod died.

When Herod died, God's angel spoke to Joseph in a dream again. "Get up, take the child and his mother and return to Israel. All who were out to kill the child are dead."


Isn't it wonderful that God sent angels to watch over his infant son and protect him from harm? Well, God loves all of his children. He loves you and me and he sends angels to watch over us. In Psalm 91, the Bible says:

Evil can't get close to you, harm can't get through the door. He ordered his angels to guard you wherever you go. If you stumble, they'll catch you; their job is to keep you from falling. (Psalm 91:11-12 - The Message)

I'm glad that we have God's angels watching over us as we walk – even in dangerous places. Be thankful that God's angels are watching over you today! (Sing) "All night, all day, angels watching over me, my Lord. All night, all day, angels watching over me, my Lord."

PRAYER: Father, we thank you for your love and protection. Amen.






