As you can see, there is a \$37,000 gap in the two figures. In addition, the first figures are based on hiring a first-year, unmarried pastor, a pastor with more experience or a family would cost more, and there are always extraneous costs like a one-time only moving cost. Fortunately, these costs could be covered by a dedicated fund we have for Youth Director salary.

There is one more advantage to bringing in a Youth Pastor. As one of my beloved Council members put it ever so gently, "You know, Pastor Bob, you're no spring chicken!

It might be less scary to have on staff a pastor with fewer miles on him/her.

I'm old enough to have been taught Confirmation by a First Lutheran Youth Pastor, Sandy Mitchell. And one of my favorite half a dozen pastors in the congregation is another First Lutheran Youth Pastor, Mike Thompson. The Youth Pastor model has worked before for First, and with God's help, it could work again.



Do you want to make a dream together?

We need to hear all voices, dreamers and pragmatists, on this one. So we will hold an Open Forum in which everyone will have a chance to speak and ask questions on *May* 6 at 9:30 a.m. in our worship space. If this time does not work for you, let us know so we can set up a second forum. We will then hold a vote on whether to increase the budget at a <u>Special Congregational Meeting</u> for all voting members at <u>9:30 a.m. and again at 12:00 a.m. on May 20</u>. (See Page 2)

Paul and I just returned from the Florida Keys the second week of April. What interesting typical Ohio weather for April. My poor daffodils have been out and trying to stand tall in the rain, snow, sleet and wind.

We stayed at a new campground this year...our old one has been leveled and now holds the skeleton of expensive condos and motel rooms. We camped in our truck camper at Big Pine Key Fishing Lodge and RV Park. Big Pine Key...hmmm...you say that name sounds familiar? It should. South of Marathon AND ground zero for Hurricane Irma, September, 2017.

What a difference one day made here. A day earlier, the headline of the Keynoter read "Keys Prepare for Hurricane". Now a picture of the newspaper box holding one last paper is battered and lying in a pile of debris.

The day-after pictures of Big Pine Key are ones of pure devastation. Half the homes in Big Pine were destroyed. Even today debris is still very evident. Many buildings are damaged or totally gone. Some homes have been moved thirty or forty feet off the foundation. RV's are damaged or gone. Up and down US 1, one still sees the mark of Irma. Where the highway meets water, piles of sand some as high as 14 feet fill the road's edge where it was plowed to open the highway that runs the length of the Keys and connects all the islands. Empty land where homes once stood. Damaged boats lying on their sides. In the Marathon Marina four hundred boats are missing...four hundred! Where are they? Where are the missing buildings? Where are the missing RV's? As a final note here, one woman in Big Pine is 277th on the list for a new roof. But she does not complain...she waits her turn.

Some businesses are gone - others are limping along - still others are functioning at better than average. The campground up the highway was totaled and will not be open until next year. The campground south was also totaled and may or may not reopen. They were both corporate owned.

BPKFL is family owned. When we first scoped out this park a year earlier, RV's and tents were hidden among the mangroves, palms and tropical plants. Now many of the palm trees are merely poles without fronds and the mangroves are stripped of their leaves. Half of the motel is missing, the other half damaged beyond use at this point. One of two canals for the boat marina damaged. RV'S damaged or gone. Mobile homes for rent gone. The office gone. The beach gone. (Steps to the beach are there.)The family returned to the island four days after, voted on where to begin and dug in. They were open for business in November.

These Conchs are lively, radiant people. They don't complain. They pick up and move forward. They blame no one. They praise the response teams even though their road was not open for four days. They helped one another from day one. They knew when they moved here that they were not immune to hurricanes but they never expected the intensity nor the damage yet...

Conchs will tell you their stories, will show you the pictures of the damage but they never complain, they never place the blame. They dig in, they help one another. They do not expect special favors. Each waits his turn.

So... How do we meet each adversity?


