HOA WINTER STORM LANDSCAPE REPAIRS

The unusual subfreezing temperatures of the winter storm in February caused widespread damage to landscape plant material throughout the state of Texas and the HOA has approved several measures to repair our damage. After waiting to see if the brown plant material would recover, Smith Lawn & Tree gave us a list of what repairs need to be done. The most obvious damage is the dead Indian Hawthorne shrubs at the Catalpa wall bed on Lexington. These will be removed and replaced with Gold Mound Spirea. A large Maple tree died on Spinks Road and it will be replaced with a Live Oak tree. Also, on Spinks Road there are several areas where the turf died from the freeze and there will be new sod placed to cover these bare areas. There will also be sod placed on the bare spots in the median of Lexington at the same time. Fortunately, the HOA board has maintained an emergency reserve fund for unexpected expenses like these. Smith Lawn & Tree will be performing this work within the next 30 days as they are quite busy with widespread repairs being done all over the Dallas/Fort Worth area. The HOA is committed to restore our landscaping to be attractive once again for the enjoyment of our residents.
