Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life. (ELW 231, Holy Baptism)

These are the words spoken as the newly baptized is given a lighted baptismal candle. These past months have provided many opportunites for us to be a "light" in the world! You will see in a message within this newsletter how Alyssa Stevens encountered the "light" through a worker at Bi-Lo. The food pantry continues to be a "light" to the community through



the distribution of food, as well as, handmade masks. The additional day for the Food Pantry has proven to be needed for the community. So far, during the month of June (thru the 12th), 42 families have come to the food pantry. That is just in the first two weeks of the month. We have also distributed 69 masks to families since May 29th. The food pantry allows Mt. Hermon to continue to be a "light" to the community.

LiveStreaming has also allowed Mt. Hermon to shine a "light" on Sunday mornings. I watch the replay of the service and count how many of you indicate that you are "worshipping too." You will notice each Sunday's bulletin the number in attendance includes a + next to the number. That + indicates we are aware others are watching, but they have not commented or indicated to me they are watching.

Another way you continue to be a "light" is by your kind comments on Facebook when you see visitors are worshipping with us. My heart is filled when I see you being the people we know we are inside the sanctuary. Our services are watched by many visitors. There are usually at least 10 visitors who comment on the service each week. Your warm, welcoming, and kind comments are extended to visitors on-line and that is also a bright "light." God continues to use us to be his "light."

Church council met on June 14th and agreed it is too soon for us to return to in-person worship. We are aware some churches have re-opened their sanctuaries and some churches have already paused their in-person worship due to members testing positive following a Sunday worship. We feel it is just not the right time for Mt. Hermon to resume in-person worship. We will continue to LiveStream on Sundays. Actually we will continue even when we are able to resume in-person worship! That being said, we have worked countless hours on researching the best ways to continue LiveStreaming. We created a LiveStreaming Worship Team. The members of that team are: Pastor Gina, Wynne Price, Earl Sease, Teddy Koon, Sheila Starkey, and Breanna Metze. We met with two companies who provided counsel and quotes. During the June 14th Council meeting, after a proposal presentation, Council gave this task force authority to move forward with making LiveStreaming and recording of the services a permanent ministry. The cost of this project is "up to \$15,000." Supplies are limited and council authorized this task force to go forth immediately with the ordering and purchasing of the needed components for this project. Many of you have expressed appreciation for this ministry and have also expressed an interest in contributing towards this project. You have an opportunity now. All of us have this opportunity. You may contribute and mark on your check/envelope: LiveStreaming Project. These funds will go directly towards this project.

We are living in very different times, but I can't imagine living anywhere else, but with you! Your kindness and love which you have expressed towards me confirms again that we are "lights in the right places together!" We will continue to build "light fixtures" together so that the "light of God" shines brightly in our community!

Congregational Council Minutes May 17, 2020 via Zoom

ATTENDANCE: All were present with the exception of Joe Koon and Karen Nicholson **CARES AND CONCERNS:** Praying for Eldon Eargle and Gene Schofield after surgery; Debbie Fulmer's mom, Iris House, living with them not doing well; former member Dan Tinman on hospice **ADOPTION OF AGENDA:** No formal agenda for this meeting

ADOPTION OF MINUTES: The minutes for the March 8, March 15, and March 25th meetings distributed

REPORTS:

- Treasurer: Written report received for April. Report to be amended due to change in insurance disbursement. Our April and May receipts exceeded expenditures and synodical payments have been made for the first six months of 2020. Parsonage utilities are being billed to church and reimbursed by renter. Our loan balance amount is \$414,028 and \$65,799.20 is leftover from our loan for air conditioner/church improvements.
- Financial Secretary: Written Report received for March and April 2020 in addition to first quarter 2020

Team Reports/Recommendations:

- 1. Worship Team: Written report received for May 4th meeting via Zoom. They are requesting estimates for improving our audio/video streaming services. Worship board requests that there be a line item in 2021 budget for expenses with video streaming our services such as stands for iPad/adapter, etc. **APPROVED**
- 2. Outreach Team: Youth are helping purchase and distribute food in the food pantry.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Parsonage: The yard has been cleaned up, house painted, air conditioner serviced and working well, and refrigerator had to be replaced. The \$700 rent will count as a regular monthly church contribution. A signed agreement was obtained and Rick Anthony will inquire about how we are insured with parsonage. After all bills have been received, Parker will get a total for all expenditures in preparing parsonage for occupancy.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Discussion about reopening church to in person services:
 - Some members have no internet to watch Sunday services-would we be able to burn them a DVD to view?
 - Our sanctuary has 37 full pews and 1 short pew that are 14 feet long which if we had 5 people per pew and skipped every other pew then we could fit 90 people not counting the 3 pews upfront for the choir
 - Fellowship Hall might be easier to set up and sanitize
 - We already have on hand 200 masks and gloves
 - Synod sent out a letter with their recommendations for safely reopening which included not doing so until there were 14 consecutive days of decreased new COVID infections, no wine for Holy Communion, no singing, wearing face masks, and shortening the length of services.
 - Council recommends continuing to keep church closed for in person services and
 activities for the next 30 days and reopening discussions on the subject at our next
 council meeting on June 14, 2020. APPROVED

After Feedback, the meeting was adjourned with praying the Lord's Prayer. Robin Ellisor, Council Secretary







Outreach Happenings...



Though Mt. Hermon is not worshipping on the church campus as a congregation, we are definitely not closed. The Food Pantry is booming. Since March 18, we have served almost 200 families with supplies for meals. Some of those 200 families have been repeat customers. Your donations are spreading God's love into our community.

If you are interested in helping with this ministry, please let Diane Boulware or the church office know. We are looking for people who can **donate three hours** either Wednesdays or Fridays **once a month**. We

appreciate the volunteers we have had, but we are losing some of them due to time conflicts with jobs and school. Please consider sharing **three hours** of your time, once

Food items that are sometimes difficult to get in the quantity we need are: Peanut Butter (small jars), Grape Jelly (small jars), Canned Beef Stew, Canned Vegetables, Pasta Sauce, Instant Potatoes and Toothpaste. If you can add some of these to your grocery list and drop them by the church, we would appreciate the donations.



Some of our students have taken on the task of keeping the food pantry stocked each week. This week, when Alyssa entered the grocery store, she was greeted with a very excited Bi-Lo employee. Bi-Lo had just given their employees a \$50 shopping spree where they could quickly choose whatever they wanted in a 5-minute shopping rush! Rather than shop for herself, Aqua decided to choose items for Mt. Hermon's food pantry, and was ready with her donation when Alyssa arrived.

Thank you Aqua for your thoughtfulness of our community. It touched our hearts, and we are deeply grateful for your contribution.

In addition to food, the food pantry has been giving face masks to our Food Pantry customers that are interested in having one. The masks have been made and donated by Annette Price, Diane Boulware and Rumiko Bouknight (Bonnie and Frank Bouknight's daughter-in-law). We have distributed 92 masks to date. This is another way we have been spreading God's love into our community.
