The Boston-Newton Marriott produced a great meal and showed tremendous professionalism and hospitality in hosting the event. Additionally the hotel is much more centrally located in the Chapter footprint.


Boston College play-by-play broadcaster Jon Meterparel again donated his time and talent as master of ceremonies for the evening. We were able to think Jon this year by presenting him with a three year membership to the National Football Foundation.

The 33 scholar-athletes were listed in the Spring, 2013 Newsletter. Accepting on behalf of all the scholar-athletes was Kyle Wisnieski, the quarterback of the 2013 EMass Superbowl Champion Mansfield Hornets.

John Moriarty, a multiple award winning lineman from Massachusetts Maritime Academy, received the third annual Jack Daly Award for Academics, Citizenship and Football. Moriarty was selected from a deep and immensely talented group of nominees.

Welch was the recipient of the Ron Burton Distinguished American Award. In addition to his outstanding coaching career, Welch was a Navy SEAL prior to his coaching career.

Welch's former Ipswich High School student and long time Ipswich High athletic department employee Thomas received the Ed Schluntz Contributions to Amateur Football Award.

JON BAKER NOMINATED FOR NFF SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Our Chapter has been very fortunate over the past several years to have two of our scholar-athletes selected as one of the four national scholar-athletes that is honored each year by the NFF at its annual awards extravaganza at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City each December. In 2011 Chelsea High School alumnus and current Princeton University wide receiver Matt Costello was picked, and in 2013 Matt's current teammate, former Barnstable High quarterback and valedictorian, Nick Peabody was honored.

This year the Chapter's nominee is **Jon Baker.** Jon played offensive and defensive line at Millis High School. After graduating in 3 ½ years, Jon enrolled at Boston College in January on a full football scholarship. Jon is fluent in Spanish and graduated with a 4.56 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale). 15 of the 25 classes he took at Millis were either honors level or advanced placement courses and in his five courses in his final semester at Millis, he received five "A+" grades. Jon was a four time Tri-Valley League All-star and was both an all-state and all-scholastic selection.

The four recipients of the national scholar-athlete award will be released in October.

SUMMER EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

The Jack Grinold Chapter Executive Committee met in late July with four items on the docket. The group reviewed the Scholar-Athlete Banquet held in May. The Chapter was so pleased with the new venue, we have again contracted with the Boston-Newton Marriott to host our banquet again next May 3. Banquet Chairman **Jim Seavey** is to be commended for his all his work on the event, not the least of which was arranging for payment to be made by credit card.

There was also much discussion of the annual Coaches Clinic. Board members **Barry Gallup**, **Steve Addazio** and **Brad Bates** at Boston College could not have been more gracious hosts. Clinic Chairman **Charlie Stevenson** reported on the record setting attendance at the event that was booked to capacity. Several minor changes may be in store for next March, not the least of which is the inclusion of vendors.

The recipients of the Ed Schluntz Contributions to Amateur Football Award and the Ron Burton Distinguished American Award were announced. The names of the honorees will be made public following the Board of Directors Meeting in December.

Chapter President **Tom Lamb** reported on the work of the Concussion Committee. It was agreed that as important as the work high schools, colleges, and the NFL is doing, much more important is the teaching of proper fundamentals of tackling at the youth level. Tom has been contacting experts in the field of concussions and hopes to have a report to deliver at the annual December Board of Directors meeting.

In December, Jack Grinold once again issued a challenge to members of the Chapter that bears his name. Jack offered to match any donations made to the Chapter up to a grand total of \$3,000.
