Governor's Proclamation Recognizes June 2, 2021, as Admiral Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. Day in Virginia

Jay Fiedler, President of the Richmond Council, Navy League of the United States, welcomed guests and friends to a ceremony at the Virginia War Memorial on Wednesday, June 2, 2021, to recognize the 50th anniversary of the promotion of Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. to the rank of Admiral. To recognize and honor the Admiral's many accomplishments, Governor Northam declared June 2, 2021, as Admiral Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. Day in Virginia.

Statement from Governor Northam

"I am pleased to honor Admiral Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. for his many ground-breaking accomplishments. It took courage and patriotism to sign up for service after Pearl Harbor. Admiral Gravely continued to display that courage with a string of firsts—from being the first African American commissioned from the Navy Reserve Officer Training Course, to becoming the first African American to command a U.S. Fleet. I'm proud that Admiral Gravely is a Virginian, and I hope that on June 2, more Virginians will learn more about him and his leadership."

NAVY TALENT ACQUISITION GROUP (NTAG) RICHMOND HOLDS CHANGE OF COMMAND CEREMONY

RICHMOND, Va. (April 30, 2021) -Navy Talent Acquisition Group (NTAG) Richmond held a virtual change of command ceremony where CDR Charles R. Harmon relieved CDR Kristopher D. Klaiber as commanding officer.

When Klaiber assumed duties and the commanding officer and Harmon checked in as the Executive Officer 20 months ago, things were completely different than they are now.

They stepped into a command, Navy Recruiting District Richmond, which was having difficulty meeting their recruiting goals and one operating and structured a completely different way than it is now.

As if that weren't enough, they were faced with and are continuing to deal with the challenges brought on by COVID-19 beginning in March of 2020.

However, through their leadership and the tenacity of their recruiters, an amazing thing happened, they started making their monthly goals and were one of the few recruiting districts nation-wide who achieved their annual goal for 2020.

Klaiber said he couldn't be more proud of how our recruiters rose above the challenges they faced in 2020.

He added recruiters not being able to go to schools, shopping centers, take part in job fairs, or people being nervous to even step into a recruiting station, made an already difficult job exponentially harder.

"You have taught me what the true definition of resilience looks like," Klaiber said

to his command via Facebook Live. "Thank you very much for placing your trust in me to guide us as your commanding officer these last 20 months."

Harmon, no stranger to recruiting, previously worked at the Military Entry and Processing Station Beckley in his native West Virginia, served as the Executive Officer for NRD Richmond/NTAG Richmond, relieved Klaiber.

Some of Harmon's previous tours include one of the first Ensigns in the Human Resource Community at the Navy Personnel Command, Enlisted Programs Officer at Navy Recruiting District Pittsburgh, Officer in Charge of Special Operations Command in Doha, Qatar, and the N131 Officer of Plans and Policy in Washington, DC, just to name a few.

Harmon thanked team Richmond for accepting and supporting him in his role as their Executive Officer and said he was excited to serve as their Skipper.

"I believe you are the greatest group of Sailors and civilians I have served with in all my 29 years," he told them.

Harmon added that the commands dedication to the mission is amazing; they are by far the best NTAG in Navy recruiting and they prove that month after month.

"Thank you so much for all that you do, not only for our Navy but the communities and citizens you serve," he said.

Headquartered in Richmond, Virginia, NTAG Richmond's mission is to man the Navy fleet with the highest quality Sailors and maintain the Navy's unchallenged worldwide maritime superiority and ability to win wars, deter aggression and maintain freedom of the seas. NTAG Richmond three Talent Acquisition operates Onboarding Centers, 41 Talent Acquisition Stations, and eight Navy Officer Recruiting Stations throughout Virginia, Southern Maryland, and Northern North Carolina.

Samuel L. Gravely, Jr.

4 June 1922 - 22 October 2004

Vice Admiral Gravely was born and raised in Richmond, VA in 1922. He joined the Navy in 1942 and rose from the rank of Seaman to Vice Admiral. In addition to being the first African American Admiral, he is also the first African American to command a US Navy warship (CHANDLER DD-717), the first African American to command an American warship under combat conditions (TAUSSIG DD-746), the first African American to command a major naval warship (JOUETT CG-29), the first African American to rise to the rank of Vice Admiral, and the first African American to command a U.S. Navy Fleet. He retired from the Navy in 1980, died at age 82 in 2004 and is buried at the Arlington National Cemetery. The Navy honored Admiral Gravely in 2010 with the commissioning of the destroyer USS GRAVELY (DDG-107), named in his honor.

The Gravely Proclamation event was sponsored by the Richmond Navy League Council with the support of the U.S. Navy and the Virginia War Memorial. The Governor's Proclamation was read and presented to Commander Corey Odom, Commanding Officer, USS GRAVELY (DG-107). Commander Odom and Laurette Cain Johnson Turner, a niece of the Admiral, recognized the many accomplishments of the Admiral's naval career a played in and personal life and the role he

breaking down barriers in the military for African Americans and other minorities. A quote from Admiral Gravely on the wall of the main hall of the Virginia War Memorial provided an excellent backdrop for the event.

"When you stand and fight for America you're defending an America that is not perfect...but it's better than any other country I know".

Approximately 40 people attended the event. Five members of the Gravely family, including Ms. Turner, his daughter Tracey Gravely and other nieces representing three generations of the family, were present. The U.S. Navy was well represented by Commander Odom, Richmonder LTJG



Connor Partlow and three other GRAVELY crew members. Several Navy officers and enlisted personnel from Richmond area Navy offices were also present. There was excellent media coverage with television stations WTVR-6, WRIC-8, WWBT-12 and WVEC-13 (Norfolk) and WHSV Channel 3 (Harrisonburg) reporting on the event. The Richmond-Times Dispatch, Stars and Stripe and the Daily Press (Hampton Roads) reported the event in their publications. Naval Surface Force Atlantic (SUFLANT), the Defense Visual Information Distribution System and the Virginia War Memorial posted stories of the event on their websites.

CERTIFICATE of RECOGNITION

By virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution of Virginia in the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, there is hereby officially recognized:

ADMIRAL SAMUEL L. GRAVELY, JR. DAY

WHEREAS, Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. was born and raised in Richmond, Virginia, in 1922; and

WHEREAS, in response to the attack on Pearl Harbor, Mr. Gravely enlisted in the Naval Reserves on September 15, 1942 and was trained as a Fireman Apprentice; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gravely was selected for the Navy V-12 program in 1943 to train as a naval officer; and

WHEREAS, in December 1944, he became the first African American commissioned from the Navy Reserve Officer Training Course; and

WHEREAS, during World War II, he served onboard a submarine chaser that was one of only two World War II ships with a largely African-American crew; and

WHEREAS, during the Korean War, he served onboard the USS Iowa, and later in the 1950s served on the USS Toledo and USS Seminole; and

WHEREAS, Admiral Gravely served during the 1960s and 1970s as executive officer and acting commander of the USS Theodore E. Chandler, commanded the USS Falgout, helped integration efforts at the Naval War College, commanded the USS Taussig under war conditions and served as coordinator of the Navy's satellite communications program; and

WHEREAS, he became the first African American to command a US Navy warship, the first African American to command an American warship under combat conditions, the first African American to command a major naval warship, the first African American admiral, the first African American to rise to the rank of Vice Admiral, and the first African-American to command a U.S Fleet; and

WHEREAS, Admiral Gravely built a Navy career that lasted 38 years and was the recipient of many prestigious awards by the time he retired in 1980, including the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, and the naming of the USS Samuel L. Gravely, Jr. (DDG-107) in his honor; and

WHEREAS, June 2, 2021, is the 50th anniversary of the ceremony marking the appointment of Samuel Gravely to the rank of Admiral;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ralph S. Northam, do hereby recognize June 2, 2021, as ADMIRAL SAMUEL L. GRAVELY, JR. DAY in our COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA, and I call this observance to the attention of all our citizens.






