Heading into Fall: Our Sunday worship and parish programs...A pastor's epistle

As summer draws to a close, we're welcoming the last of our First Eucharist candidates from this past year and we're gearing up to welcome new groups of candidates for Confirmation and Eucharist during the coming year. It has been a blessing to be able to intersperse the welcome of these candidates into our Sunday community masses. It is important to see these events as not something that "happens" to individuals but as renewing moments for our whole community.

Actually this year's class of First Eucharist candidates would have been too large to accommodate in the same, single celebration as has been our custom in the past. We foresee similar large candidate groups this coming year. In recent years, Confirmation has been celebrated with other parishes at either the Cathedral in St. Paul or Basilica in Minneapolis instead of in each parish's own church. With Covid's appearance this past year, however, the Archbishop has authorized pastor's to confirm their own candidates at their own respective parishes. We don't know yet, if that situation will be repeated this year. At St. Cecilia we prepare Confirmation candidates every other year, so this year will mark the return of our preparation program for that sacrament. If there are any adults among us who have not been confirmed or have an older family member needing to complete any sacraments, it will be important for us to assist them in their preparation.

Theresa has worked hard to develop safe ways to proceed with our faith formation program this year. It will mean working with smaller family groups as well as keeping our Good Shepherd and sacramental preparation programs going. We'll need to have lots of cleaning protocol in place to create a safe environment for students and families.

Regarding Sunday worship, it does not yet look like conditions will be safe in the near future for us to open up safely and more fully for the community. This remains disappointing because of our desire to be able to be fully engaged in our singing and responding when we do gather at liturgy. So far, we've been able to accommodate small groups, like our First Eucharist families. Now that these events are completed, we may be able to have small numbers of other parishioners join us. We'd like to give some precedence to people who would like to join us ahead of a pending surgery and share anointing of the sick or for baptism or to grieve with us the loss of a loved one. We also have some parishioners who do not have internet access or computer to receive our recorded mass.

If people are interested to join us on occasion or for an occasion, I ask that you would email or call Marge during the preceding week to let us know/determine if there are any conflicts anticipated. We need to anticipate who and when people would like to attend: no drops ins, please. Given the enclosed nature of the worship space and our need to have cantors, lectors and presider be mask-free when performing their respective roles, we need to keep the total number of additional people in the church limited to 10-15 people. We do not yet consider ourselves "open" for public worship. Anyone not serving a liturgical ministry needs to maintain safe distance and wear a mask in the building. I'm grateful to all who are working to make our weekly mass available and I'm happy that the quality of our recording has meant that our liturgies have proven to be a meaningful way for many of us to stay connected with each other.
