

Does Faith in Jesus Matter?

The ELCA New England Synod is asking that the Great Commission be declared null and void. Of course, that isn't what a resolution passed at their 2017 assembly claims it is doing, but it certainly would be the result.

In fact, their rather curious version of the Great Commission in the first "whereas" clause of the resolution states, "Whereas the evangelical mandate of Christ to his apostles in Matthew 28:18-21 calls us to make his teaching and presence known throughout this earth's nations..." Funny, my Bible says that we are to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the Triune Name and teaching them to observe all Jesus commanded. Maybe they found a more ancient manuscript and haven't told anybody.

Of course, this brings back memories of the first edition of the AugsburgFortress *Lu*theran Study Bible, which contained a long, windy commentary on the Great Commission that pretty much said that when Jesus said to make disciples of all nations, he didn't really mean that we should make disciples of all nations. So this is nothing new. (After many objections, later editions simply have no commentary on Matthew 28:16-20)

The Resolution asks "...that the New England Synod memorialize the ELCA Churchwide Assembly to initiate a process to amend the phrase 'bring all people to faith in Christ' in C4.02b and its constitutional parallels in order to achieve greater consonance with both our understanding of Christian witness and sensitivity to our interfaith contexts."

The synod website doesn't include minutes of the assembly that we can find, but we understand that the resolution passed overwhelmingly, and the version on their website says "final."

According to the resolution, its purpose, which is admirable, is to advance inter-faith dialogue in a context of mutual respect. Surely as Lutherans we understand that faith can never be forced but is a free act of the Holy Spirit as He comes through the Word and the Sacraments, which the resolution notes.

And it notes that we should not exclusively (in italics in the resolution) be trying to convert others, but reach out in love that genuinely values and respects our neighbors. And so far I agree with their expressed intent.

But in the end, any interfaith dialogue needs to be among partners who really believe what their faith teaches. So, yes, we should be trying to convert our dialogue partners and they should be trying to convert us. Otherwise we are pretty much saying that "it doesn't matter what you believe as long as you're sincere," a popular slogan which is utterly ridiculous (who is more sincere today than members of ISIS? In fact it is people who are sincerely evil who are the most dangerous!)

August 15: The Assumption of Mary into Heaven

The Doctrine of the Assumption of the Mary

The Assumption is a doctrine that teaches that the Blessed Virgin Mary had been taken up, body and soul, into heaven. This process is called "translation" in the Bible and there are two notable examples in the scripture, Enoch (Hebrews 11:5) and Elijah (2 Kings 2:11). At the Council of Chalcedon in A.D. 451, when bishops from throughout the Mediterranean met in Constantinople, Emperor Marcian asked the Patriarch of Jerusalem to bring the relics of Mary to Constantinople to be enshrined in the capitol. The patriarch explained to the emperor that there were no relics of Mary in Jerusalem, that "Mary had died in the presence of the apostles; but her tomb, when opened later . . . was found empty and so the apostles concluded that the body was taken up into heaven." There is no scriptural evidence to support or deny this doctrine as applied to Mary.

The Pregnancy Center is a nonprofit pro-life organization of committed Christians sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ and actively helping women, men and families in Crisis pregnancy situations. We at Crisis Pregnancy Center of Gaston County, Inc. would like to welcome you to our center.

The Walk for Life is a way to raise money for the Crisis Pregnancy Center. At the event there will be no money raised, but a time of celebration and fun with activities for all children, youth, and adults from 4:00 until 8:00 p.m. Key activities besides the walking track are: hot-tethered balloon, rock climbing wall, slide, moon bounce, crafts table, face painting and free hot

dogs, popcorn, and drinks. Praise music and times of worship from 6:00-7:30 p.m.

Our History

Roe vs. Wade in 1973 had gone unanswered in Gaston County, until on November 13, 1985, at 10:00 o'clock a.m. an initial meeting of the Board of Directors was held at the law offices of Cherry, Bekaert, & Holland here in Gastonia.

Seven men and women came together as God had encouraged their hearts to respond compassionately to the needs of those facing unplanned pregnancies. They gathered to initiate a ministry that would upon opening their doors for clients in September of 1986 have an immediate impact.

- No longer would words be heard without matching deeds and actions that gave a visible expression of our concern for the abortion issue.
- No longer would someone who could not afford a pregnancy test be denied one.
- No longer would the longing for a listening ear, a compassionate, caring counselor when the crisis of pregnancy came about be denied.
- No longer would the everyday needs of material assistance and crisis calls from clients of needing a listening ear, go unanswered.

On that day, this Board of Directors, composed of Dale Chase, Rev. Marion Clark, Audrue McMahan, David Ward, Rev. Marlin Mull, Peter Caprise, Rachel Pichet and Cathy Epperson nominated officers, set meeting times, elected an Executive Director, and voted to request information from a sister CPC. Other Board members unable to attend that day were: Steve Baker, Laura C. Atkins, Rev. M.O. Owens, Dr. Glenn Phoenix and Dr. Thomas Will.

From that humble beginning, the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Gaston County has been in three pivotal rental locations and finally was able to purchase property and a home in July 1996. The journey from those initial days included leadership from diversely skilled Board of Director Members, to Executive Directors, to multi-talented staff, to service by Volunteers that utilized the gifts of individuals as well as the strengths of an interdenominational ecumenical corporate body working for the cause of the unborn.

The history of the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Gaston County, Inc. has included immeasurable faith, the development of a support base that transcends race, gender and religion. The experience of serving in this setting allows women, men and their families to see the efforts of all combined to meet the needs of one. It is an awesome testimony to see so many varied agencies, individuals, and churches tackling this single issue.

From its inception, the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Gaston County, Inc. has now served 50,000+ clients, been blessed by faithful volunteers, trusted God for budget needs numerous times, and made an impact in this County that is now indelible and indispensable.

Over the years, an expanding staff, a diversified Board, Abstinence emphasis, ultrasound/medical clinic, seasoned and well trained volunteers, public presentations, our annual fund-raisers, ad. infitnitum, are making the future as bright as God's genius and calling.

The Friendship Day History

There is not much literature on Friendship Day history as we celebrate today. However, there are numerous folktales and several instance in mythological legends that shows that friends and friendship have been valued since the beginning of civilized world. As an intrinsically social creature, men love to make friends to further this process of socialization.

History of Friendship Day in US

Considering the valuable role friends play in our life it was deemed to fit to have a day dedicated to friends and friendship. The United States Congress, in 1935, proclaimed **first Sunday of August as the National Friendship Day**. Since then, celebration of National Friendship Day became an annual event. The noble idea of honoring the beautiful relationship of friendship caught on with the people and soon Friendship Day became a hugely popular festival.

Following the popularity and success of Friendship Day in US, several other countries adopted the tradition of dedicating a day to friends. Today, Friendship Day is enthusiastically celebrated by several countries across the world including India.

In 1997, the United Nations named Winnie - the Pooh as the world's Ambassador of Friendship.

Importance of Friendship in Bible

The Bible, the primary text of the western civilization, reflects upon friendship as the bond that forms the foundation to human faith, trust and companionship. Following verses from the bible aptly portray the importance of friends:

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Matthew 7:7

"Greater love hath no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13-15

Besides, there are several tales from the Old Testament and the New Testament about the value of friendship and how true friendship is a treasure to unearth. A noticeable point is that, both the versions make a difference between the two broad meanings of friendship- one is a mere acquaintance, the other is a more affectionate relation.

In the **Old Testament**, Abraham is called the "friend of God" because of the intimacy of his relations. God speaks to Moses face to face "as a man...unto his friend" (Ex 33:11). The romantic friendship of Ruth and Naomi, the devotion of the subordinate Hushai for David, or the mutual relation between David and Jonathan - the Old Testament is replete with these interesting tales of friends and friendship.

In the **New Testament**, the relationship between Jesus and his disciples clearly depicts how human friendship can constantly grow. From being teacher and disciple, to lord and servant their relationship finally grew to an unparalleled friendship.

A Stewardship Minute

The August issue of *Stewardship* is full of explanations of what Christian stewardship really is. Listen to one writer's thoughts: "Christian stewardship is the means by which we make the church and the Kingdom of God a joy rather than a burden." Another writer wrote the following: "Whenever we consider Christian stewardship as a response to God for the salvation we have through Christ's love and sacrifice we want to respond. ways about money. Money is obviously important for the church and the Kingdom of God but offering our time, our talent, our labor, our thoughtfulness are also needed.

Some years ago the gifted painter, Norman Rockwell, painted a picture of a Cathedral with 19 people walking in front of it. What is unusual about the people is that every one of them was walking with their head bent down as though each one had a heavy burden and was without hope. But if each of those sad people had looked up toward the big door of the church they would have seen a sign of hope. The door was opened and a priest was standing there as if he could have offered hope for each of the people. There is one more sign of hope to be seen in that painting. A workman was standing on a ladder having just finished putting words on a sign. The sign read: "Lift up thine eyes." Lift up thine eyes. That sign offered hope. The clergyman offered hope. The church offered hope.

Prayer: Dear Lord, as you know, your world is full of wars and woes. Help us to be good servants bearing your words of love and wisdom to an aching world. **Amen**


The Medal of Honor that is now the Purple Heart actually began as the 'Badge of Military Merit.' On August 7th, 1782 in Newburgh, New York, General George Washington designed a new badge of distinction for enlisted men and noncommissioned officers. They were awarded for 'any singularly meritorious action.' The badge was a figure of a heart in purple cloth or silk, edged with narrow lace or binding. It was pinned to a uniform coat above the left breast. That was then, this is now.

On January 7th of the year 1931, a new design was reopened. Ms. Elizabeth Will, an army heraldic specialist in the Office of the Quarter, created the design sketch for the present medal of the Purple Heart. It consists of a purple enameled heart within a bronze quarter inch border showing a relief profile of George Washington in continental uniform. Washington's family coat of arms adorns the medal, along with an inscription inside the heart that reads, 'For Military Merit.'


The Purple Heart is awarded to any member of the Armed Forces that has been wounded or killed, died as a result of a wound in battle, or otherwise designated by the President of the United States. This now includes those persons killed as a result of friendly fire. Now we celebrate Purple Heart Day on the anniversary of its inception, August 7th. On this day it is our patriotic duty to remember and recognize those people willing to serve our country, no matter the price.

ONE THING ABOUT THE ANTICHRIST IS CERTAIN: HE HAS ALREADY LOST. Billy Graham/My Answer

B: Is the antichrist alive today? I'm not sure I know what the antichrist is, but the world is in such a mess that I sometimes wonder if we're already living in the last days.

A: The Bible refers to the antichrist as an evil person of great spiritual power who will appear at the end of the present age (just before Christ returns to establish His Kingdom, as He has promised). The Bible says that shortly before Christ comes again, "the man of lawlessness is revealed. ...He will oppose and will exalt himself over everything that is call God" (2 Thessalonians 2:3-4).

As the name "Antichrist" implies, he will be completely and utterly opposed to Christ and His people. He even will try to get people to worship him by calming to be God, and both by his words and his actions he will do everything he can fight against everything God is doing in the world. Just as Satan tried to temp Jesus and stop Him from following God's will for His life, so Satan and his demonic forces will attempt to overpower Christ as the end of the present age draws near.

Is the antichrist alive today? On one hand, the bible urges us not to speculate about this or become overly anxious about it. On the other hand, however, it does warn us to be alert -- because Satan and his servants are always active. The Bible says, "Even how many antichrists have come" (1 John 2:18).

The most important fact about the antichrist, however is that he will not win! Like his master, Satan, he is already a defeated foe – because by Christ's death and resurrection He has gained the victory over all the forces of evil. Is your faith and hope in Him?

We of Lutheran CORE have been saying all along that the issues in the ELCA are not really about sex but about Jesus: Who He is and what He does. The action of the New England Synod certainly proves us correct.

The sainted James Burtness wrote an article many years ago as he saw this beginning in the LCA. You don't have to read the article (which was in *Dialog*), because the title says it all: *Does Anybody Out There Care Any More Whether Anybody Believes in Jesus*?

We need to ask whether it was really necessary for Jesus to take on human flesh and die on the cross for salvation, or is this just a story invented by some ancient Jews to express "spiritual" truths? Is Jesus really the only Son of the Father, an eternal Person of the Trinity, or is he another great teacher along with the Buddha, Mohammed, and the famous rabbis?

While the intentions of those asking the ELCA no longer to seek "to bring all people to faith in Christ" may be honorable (and a cynic would note that the ELCA hasn't been trying all that hard anyhow), in fact their proposal simply shows that too many in prominent positions in the ELCA no longer believe that faith in Jesus matters (the motion passed with little or no expressed objection according to our sources). Or at least they don't believe that it matters in the sense the Bible teaches, that there is "no other Name under heaven by which we must be saved."

Pr. Haug notes in this issue that the ELCA has been very sloppy in dealing with attacks on the faith from within. It is long past time for bishops and other ELCA leaders to stand up and shout, "Enough!" If faith in Jesus doesn't matter, then the ELCA should go out of business, sell its property, and designate the proceeds to various good works. And let those disciples who believe "the faith once delivered to the saints" go about making disciples by baptizing and teaching as Jesus commanded.
