

#### Parashas Shema Devarim 6:4

<u>"Hear, O Israel the Lord is our G-d the Lord is one."</u> These words of monotheism, are recited in our daily prayers, every day in the morning service of Shacharis and the evening service of Mariev. They are also said every evening before retiring. It is Israel's confession of faith. The worshippers proclaim their allegiance to the Kingdom of Heaven and a joyful submission to G-d's laws and commandments (Torah). They proclaim that the G-d of Israel is one and the only one of the Jewish people. The words of Shema in Hebrew are plural. They mean to all the world, that the G-d of all other gods worshipped by people are submissive to the one G-d of our Jewish people. Concisely our G-d alone is G-d, who was, is, and ever will be.

The opening sentence of the Shema occupies the true meaning of the Jewish religion. Every other Jewish belief turns upon it: all goes back to it; all flows from it. It is our faith in the oneness of the human race: The prophet Malachi formulated that truth in the following words:

"Have we not one Father Hath not one G-d created us Why then do we deal treacherously with one against his neighbor!"

<u>Martyrs</u> The Shema was the last cry of most Jewish martyrs before their death. It was the expression of their unshakable faith. For even though they personally were facing in many cares a cruel death, they nevertheless continued to believe in the one G-d as the Father of all our people. It is of the utmost importance for us to keep alive the undaunted faith of our martyrs. In that way we dedicate ourselves to the Kingdom of Heaven where lives justice and peace that gives us courage in the face of danger and meaning to the struggle of life.

<u>Conclusion</u> Out of the 5,845 verses of the Torah the one verse, the Shema, is the inscription for Israel's banner of faith and victory. Throughout all of literature there is probably no words found that can be compared to the intellectual and spiritual influence of them upon all of humanity. The six word statement of the Shema have become the battle-cry of the Jewish people for over 25 centuries.
