## LANDSCAPE NOTES

Hello everyone here in our lovely Chantarelle community. As I sit here to write our landscape update, I gaze out my window into our garden. It is a gorgeous sunny day. Yes, *another* sunny day. As beautiful as it is, and it IS gorgeous with spring about to burst all around us, we need more rain! What was a lovely rainy December has sadly and unfortunately not continued into this new year. So this has become the "landscape" of our landscape work at Chantarelle: to continue to adapt to the conditions that are upon us and which are clearly becoming a longer term trend. So at the risk of your tiring of hearing about this, no doubt it will be a consistent theme in our newsletter updates each month.

**Drought-saving Measures:** With winter's cooler temperatures, even though we haven't had much rain this year, our irrigation for the lawns is turned off. We keep a watchful eye out, and if we see the brown patches increase too much, we will slowly re-introduce watering to our lawns. Meanwhile, we are watering the shrubs in front of everyone's home once a week to ensure they thrive through this winter, particularly the new ones we planted last fall. As the year progresses, Debbie and I will continue to educate ourselves about the best practices for stewarding our landscape through this ongoing dry condition.

**Our Beautiful Trees:** Ryan Garrison and his team from Art and Science Tree Service did an excellent job of pruning and trimming a number of our trees in mid-February. As you know, this is an annual practice we engage in order to maintain the health and aesthetics of our trees. We are soon to schedule Ryan to remove the Mistletoe that is growing in at least a dozen trees lining our streets. Even though Mistletoe has an enchanting name and much mythology associated with it, it is an invasive species and damages healthy trees. We will ensure it is removed before it spreads to even more of our community's trees.

Creativity Percolating: Debbie and I meet regularly, and one topic we always discuss is how we can improve the beauty of our neighborhood. This year we are budgeting for three upgrading and beautifying projects: our Chantarelle entrance on Arnold Drive, the front of the clubhouse, and our entrance to Chantarelle on Watmaugh Drive. In all of our planning, we are orienting our ideas toward low water and low maintenance plants, preferably ones that flower abundantly and also create habitat for birds, butterflies and bees. Northern California natives would be the most ideal of all! We will keep you posted as these projects develop.

**Colorful ideas:** For those of you who would like to add the delight of more color to the entrance of your home, we recommend creating window boxes to put on the ledge in front of your garage window. If you've ever traveled to Switzerland in the summer, you no doubt have seen what amazing beauty almost everyone there creates with color in their window boxes! Annuals such as Petunias, Zinnias, Geraniums, Marigolds and Pansies work well for those of you who have plenty of sun. For those of us who have more shaded window areas, you can try Begonias, Impatiens, Forget-me-nots, and even Lobelia. Our local nurseries such as Sonoma Mission Gardens have wonderful folks who can help you create a bit of magic with your

window boxes. And now is the time to start planting so you can enjoy that color all summer long. Until next month, have a happy March!

#### **SAFETY & WELFARE NOTES**

Hans Steuck has provided this timely advice from AARP...

What is it Tax ID Theft? Personal information is stolen for a fraudulent refund. More specifically, tax identity theft can involve: filing a tax return using another person's Social Security number; claiming someone else's children as dependents; or claiming a tax refund using a deceased tax-payer's information. Personal information can be stolen in a number of ways, including theft of mail or tax returns, corrupt tax preparation services, or phony emails from imposters. Con artists can quickly learn a lot about you in order to take your money while also defrauding the government. What to do? To avoid tax identity theft: mail tax returns as early in the tax season as possible before the cons beat you to it; don't give out personal information unless you know who's asking for it and why they need it; shred personal and financial documents; know your tax preparer; check the status of your refund after filing at irs.gov/Refunds.
