

Supervisor Hebert called the meeting to order at 6:58 P.M. at the Ganges Township Hall, 1904 64th St. Board members present by roll call attendance: Looman, Yonkers, Hebert, Reimink and Hutchins.

Yonkers moved, Looman seconded, to accept the agenda dated 6/01/07 with the change to move Public Comments to item 4 and renumber the remaining items. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Fifteen comments in favor of keeping 121st open for use as a beach were made by the audience with requests for the township to appeal the Court's decisions.

Tom Jessup, County Commissioner, asked what the Township's next step was. Hebert responded the 30 day appeal clock had not started yet.

Yonkers moved, Looman seconded, that the Board go into a closed session to consult with attorneys regarding trial or settlement strategy in connection with the pending litigation filed by Tiltens and Stege Trust, for the reason that an open meeting would have a detrimental financial effect on the litigating or settlement position of the Township. Motion carried by roll call vote as follows: Looman – yes; Yonkers – yes; Reimink – yes; Hutchins – yes; Hebert – yes (5/0).

The regular meeting was recessed at 7:20 PM and the Board went to the office area for the closed session.

Hebert moved, Looman seconded, to adjourn the closed session at 7:52 PM. Motion carried.

Hebert called the regular meeting back to order at 7:53 PM.

Yonkers moved, Hebert seconded, for Ganges Township to appeal any and all adverse rulings of the Circuit Court to the Michigan Court of Appeals. Motion carried by roll call vote as follows: Hutchins – yes; Reimink – yes; Yonkers – yes; Looman – yes; Hebert – yes (5/0).

Looman moved, Hebert seconded, to adjourn the meeting at 7:55 PM. Motion carried.
