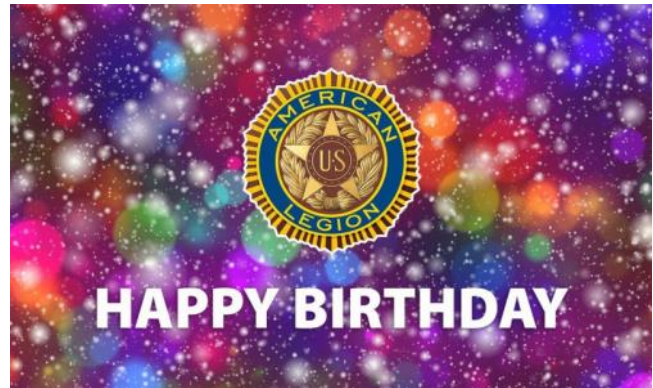
Greetings all:

Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Dinner, March 29!

Membership. With 2VC Jose Martinez on an extended vacation, it might seem like there is no need to bring up the matter of membership, but the numbers do not lie. As of Feb. 24, we only reached 383 members of the 482 goal or 79.46%. That means we still have the second most members of any Post in District 29. But the fact that we have more members than any other Post in our District except Post 291 is inadequate if the Legion is to survive. So far this fiscal year, we only have 27 new members – simply not enough to replace those we lose to passing or non-renewing. Without member replacement, there will be no American Legion.

Please, **enroll one new veteran** as a member, and **burn a fire on those who failed to renew**. We need everyone!!!

On the bright side, Post 132 is a member of District 29 (i.e., Orange County) and D29 is within Area 5 and is the membership leader (i.e., #1) of Area 5. Even more impressive, of the 30 Legion Districts in California, **District 29 is the #1 in Department of California (55,603) membership with 6,818 members!**

District 29 Meeting. D29 will have a District Assembly at Los Alamitos Post 716 on Sunday, **April 2**, at Noon. All Orange County Legion Posts are expected to attend and participate and visitors are always welcome.

Area 5 Meeting. On **March 24, 25 and 26**, Area 5 (i.e., Riverside D21, San Diego D22, San Bernardino D25, Orange D29, and Imperial D30) will meet. Business meeting on Sunday, March 26 at Midway City Post 555 at 10AM. Post 132 will be present and guest are also welcome to attend. As host District and Post 132 being D29’s flagship, we always endeavor to make an impressive showing at these events.

Preamble, Clause 8. As I promised in last Bugle issue, each issue I will review one of the ten clauses (pledges) of the Legion Preamble that we recite at each Legion function. Last issue I reviewed the seventh clause. Eight is **“TO MAKE RIGHT THE MASTER OF MIGHT”**.

The official Legion Headquarters interpretation of this clause is that “All wars from the veterans of which The American Legion draws its membership were started by dictators who wanted their might to be the right. If human freedom is not to perish from the earth, right must always be master of might. The rights of small nations must be protected against the tyranny that powerful neighbors may seek to impose on them just as the rights of minorities in our society must be protected and respected. **Our belief in enthroning right over might** is the main essence of our ideological conflict with Communism today. **Legionnaires are pledged by this clause always to stand with the right, protect the weak and preserve the liberties of the individual.** This concept is the basis of The American Legion’s continued advocacy of a strong national preparedness so as to achieve the ideal situation that right will be backed by adequate might.” Emphasis added.

Finally, remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion’s Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary.

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



George Wilhelm Leichtfuss was born December 12, 1895 in Milwaukee. He was 10th of 11 children born to German immigrant and draper/upholsterer August Leichtfuss, and his German-born wife, Augusta.

According to his 1917 World War I draft card, 21-year-old George was working as a telegraph operator in San Bernardino county for the Santa Fe railroad. He was drafted into the Army on September 19, 1917, five months after the US declared war on Germany. George was among the first draftees sent to Camp Lewis in Washington state, a new-at-the-time training camp 17 miles south of Tacoma.

In December, George went to Hoboken, New Jersey where he boarded the SS Leviathan, a one-time German ocean liner that was seized by the US government when the US entered World War I (the only seized ship not to have engines intentionally damaged by German crews).

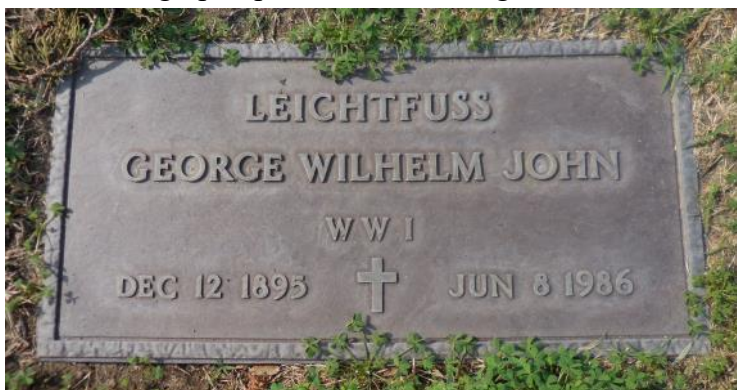
Side note: The Leviathan was the largest passenger ship in the world when it began service as the Vaterland in 1914. Its ocean liner capacity was 1,965 passengers. As a military transport ship, however, it transported 7,000 troops (later 14,000 when troops had to share bunks and take turns to sleep).

George, who was serving in Company C of the 164th infantry, arrived in England on Christmas Eve, and then arrived in France on January 10, 1918. His first experience in action was early in February. He was stationed behind the lines until April 1, when he was sent to the front.

On May 10, 1918, George's mom and dad received a telegram no military parent wants to get. It stated that George was "severely wounded in action on May 1." The nature and extent of the young man's injuries were not written in the telegram, and now that 100+ years have passed, we'll likely never know what the injuries actually were. But we do know he survived. Records indicate he stayed in France until June 1919, seven months after the war ended. George was honorably discharged in July.



In April 1920, George, 24, married Armilda Frick Ahlefeld, 25. In 1926, the couple gave birth to their daughter Joyce. They welcomed second daughter Jean in 1930. George continued to work as a railroad telegraph operator at the Orange train station through at least 1950. We're not certain when he retired, but the railroad industry saw a decline in the 1950s and early 1960s, so we can guess he likely retired in that era.



In 1983, when George was 87, his wife Armilda passed away. George soldiered on for another three years, eventually passing away himself on June 8, 1986 at age 90. George and Armilda are both interred at Santa Ana Cemetery. We thank you Sergeant Leichtfuss for your wartime service.
