

PAUL D. LOVELACE

1912 - 1996

Paul D. Lovelace, 83, longtime Sebawaing resident and businessman, died Sunday afternoon, Jan. 7, at the home of his daughter, Cindy Boyson, in Saginaw, following a brief illness.

He was born in Bad Axe on Jan. 17, 1912, a son of Abram and Louise (Watt) Lovelace. He was married to Marie A. Anderson on June 29, 1935, in Auburn. She preceded him in death on Dec. 24, 1985, following a long career as a teacher.

Mr. Lovelace purchased the Sebawaing Dairy at the age of 18 and was a buttermaker for many years. During World War II he was employed at Defoe Shipbuilding in Bay City. Later he farmed and operated a scrap yard. He also was employed at Michigan Sugar Company in Sebawaing during several processing campaigns.

He was a life member of Northern Star Lodge #277 F.&A.M., Sebawaing.

Surviving are four daughters and one son, and their spouses: Janet and Donald Beers of Sebawaing, Sharon and Scott Gugino of Midland, Paula Yarbrough of Cement City, Cynthia and Dr. Dennis Boyson of Saginaw and Daniel M. Lovelace of Orlando, FL, 17 grandchildren, 19 great-grandchildren, one sister, Ellen Nutt of South Bend, IN, and several nieces and nephews.

Three brothers and five sisters preceded him in death.

The funeral service will take place at 11 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 10, at Dinkel-Juengel Funeral Home, Sebawaing. Rev. Michael Norton will officiate with burial in Silverlawn Cemetery, Sebawaing.
