






COVID-19 UPDATE

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Dear colleagues

Well – here we are again. As I write, the number of new daily confirmed cases of coronavirus in the UK has topped 60,000 for the first time since the pandemic started, hospitals are at breaking point and we are entering the third national lockdown.

Over the course of the last nine months or so. Derbyshire UNISON has issued a number of guides and other information to all members, or specific groups. Most of these are still available on our website derbyshireunison.com. We're not going to repeat everything; most members are well aware of the major issues. Social care and schools

But it would be remiss of me not to use this opportunity to thank members, including the many of you who have joined in the last few months, for your work. Our social care members, particularly those working in residential care homes for older people have had to work through everything, with little or no PPE at first and watch the people they care for die in large numbers. And the vast majority if these get paid far less than already underpaid NHS colleagues.

In the last few days, our schools members, in tandem with teachers, have demonstrated their commitment to safety and stopping the further spread of the pandemic by forcing the government into another humiliating Uturn. Make no mistake, all the scientific information was available to Boris Johnston on Sunday when he was telling parents to send their children to school. It didn't suddenly materialise on Monday!

Members stepping forward

In loads of other work functions, too, we have assisted members to stand up for themselves. Workers who, a year ago, wouldn't speak out for fear of 'rocking the boat' have been challenging CEOs and senior managers. Some of those are now coming forward to get more involved in UNISON, to share their enlightening experiences with others. We want more to do that.

Of course, the lockdown doesn't mean everything is sorted. There are many unanswered issues. The rules on travelling to work are too loose in our opinion; we think only essential work needs to be carried out at work and we are not at all happy that members whose job

Nurseries and early years settings

There is still an outstanding issue about nurseries and early years settings being excluded from the education shutdown. I have already been involved with UNISON's national and regional officials to seek to get that, firstly clarified, and then changed if necessary.

People who know me are aware I'm not one to get on my soap box and have a rant; I leave that to others. My involvement in UNISON over many years has been to ensure workers get treated fairly and that includes pay!

But it annoys me when I read that chief executive pay is about 120 times that of the typical UK worker or, in other words, by 5:30pm on Wednesday, 6th January, they will already have overtaken the wage full time workers will get for the whole of 2021!

It annoys me that at a time when almost 2 million have died in a pandemic, when millions more are losing their jobs and livelihoods, that Jeff Bezos of Amazon saw his personal wealth increase in 2020 from \$70bn to \$185bn.

It annoys me that every government announcement on the pandemic is made with private profits uppermost in their minds and safety and ordinary folk like you and me well down the list. Somewhere, we have it incredibly wrong!

All this unfairness makes me believe even more that trade unions and their members have a crucial role to play in building a better world. If you're like me, why not join me?! Give me a call and we can have a chat about anything you want!
