This weekend we veil the statues and crucifixes until the celebration of Easter. This is done for a couple of reasons. This tradition comes from the old liturgical calendar prior to the reforms of the Second Vatican Council and the 5th Sunday of Lent was known as the beginning of Passiontide to lead us into celebrating Palm Sunday. On Good Friday, the only image that is unveiled is the crucifix. It is not as if we don't like to look at sacred art in fact the opposite is true. Veiling the statues creates a longing for seeing them and focusing on our Lord's Passion. I will offer confessions on the following days, times, and locations: Friday, April 12th before stations at Tabor at 4:45 and when I get to Lesterville for stations at 7:00 pm. On Palm Sunday I will offer confessions at 3:00 pm in Tabor and at 6:30 at Saint Agnes church. On Holy Thursday, I will offer confessions after the Eucharist has been moved to the chapel and confessions will be in the church. On Good Friday, I will hear confessions from 1:30 to 2:30 in Tabor and from 5:30-6:30 at Sigel. On Holy Saturday, I will offer confessions at 12:00 pm in Tabor and at Lesterville at 3:00 pm. I look forward to celebrating my first Holy Week as pastor with you.

If you are looking for some reading as we approach Holy Week I offer two suggestions. The Passion Narratives from each gospel are found in Matthew: 26-28, Mark 14-16, Luke 22-24, and John 17-20. Another piece of reading would be a meditation by Blessed John Henry Newman titled: "Mental Sufferings of Our Lord in His Passion." I came across this meditation from listening to a Catholic radio broadcast called Catholic Answers Live. We know that Jesus suffered physical torments and this meditation helps us understand how Jesus suffered emotionally and psychologically. I have placed some copies of this at the entrances to the church. The booklets for the Stations of the Cross will remain near the entrances to the churches through Good Friday. Another series of reflections that I have used for the Stations of the Cross are written by Saint Josemaria Escriva and if you go to www.escrivaworks.org you can find the reflections by clicking on "The Way of the Cross." Lastly, the film "The Passion of the Christ" is a remarkable, yet difficult film to watch due to the graphic scenes but it shows the reality of the suffering that Jesus endured for all of us.

This is a follow up in addition to last week's bulletin. I had hoped to offer more but the limitation of space got the best of me. I offered what I offered because people have asked me what they are supposed to do during Mass at different points in the Mass, this is not meant to be me on a soapbox. Another point to make is that there are always two ways to read the documents of the Church: a more strict reading and a looser reading. What I offered was a more strict interpretation and the looser interpretation is that since the documents don't state what we are supposed to do at each and every point during Mass, there may be room for variations. A point to end on might be this: when we come to Mass, we are there to worship God. We are not there to be entertained, but to be drawn into Jesus' offering of himself at the Last Supper and at Calvary. I hope and pray that all of us may take part in this as members of Christ's body: the Church.

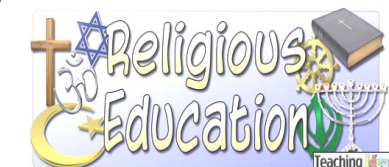
