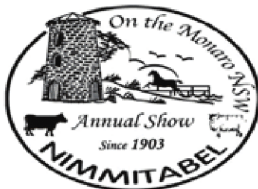

Having spent so much time away from home, I hope that the showgirl experience will give me an opportunity to reconnect with my local community. I look forward to becoming more involved with the Nimmitabel Show and seeing where this experience leads me.

Sarah's heart is in the country and returns to help out on their Charolais Stud at Cooma as much as possible and is involved in the selection of genetics for their Charolais breeding program.

Sarah attended St Pauls College Walla Walla to complete her HSC studies at which time Sarah was the senior leader of the Rural Youth Team helping with breaking and

preparing cattle for local Agricultural shows around Albury, Henty, The Rock, Cootamundra then entering the college team for the Canberra Royal, Melbourne and Sydney Royal Shows. During the evenings Sarah completed her Certificate IV in Wool Classing with the Riverina TAFE receiving an award for the highest average mark.

Sarah has a keen eye for livestock and enjoys showing and judging beef cattle. Sarah was Reserve Junior Champion Beef Cattle Judge and Reserve Junior Champion Merino Wool Judge at Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2015.

Following this success Sarah was invited to be the Australian RAS representative in New Zealand in both Dairy Cattle and Beef Cattle judging and Parading. The opportunity gave Sarah networking opportunities seeing her returning to New Zealand to assist during the showing season for 5 months over summer on Rauriki Charolais Stud in the North Island and Grampians Angus Stud in the South Island. Sarah was involved with artificial insemination, breaking and showing cattle, lamb docking and horses.

Upon completion of the HSC Sarah deferred her university entry to take up a position as Junior Draftsperson at Kotzur Silo's. Sarah quickly grasped the design and drafting of grain silo's and bulk handling systems, wishing to progress further in this field, Sarah took up her university entry into a Bachelor of Engineering at the University of Wollongong. Sarah is keen to continue design and drafting to assist the primary production in Agricultural fields and finds inspiration in all things farming.

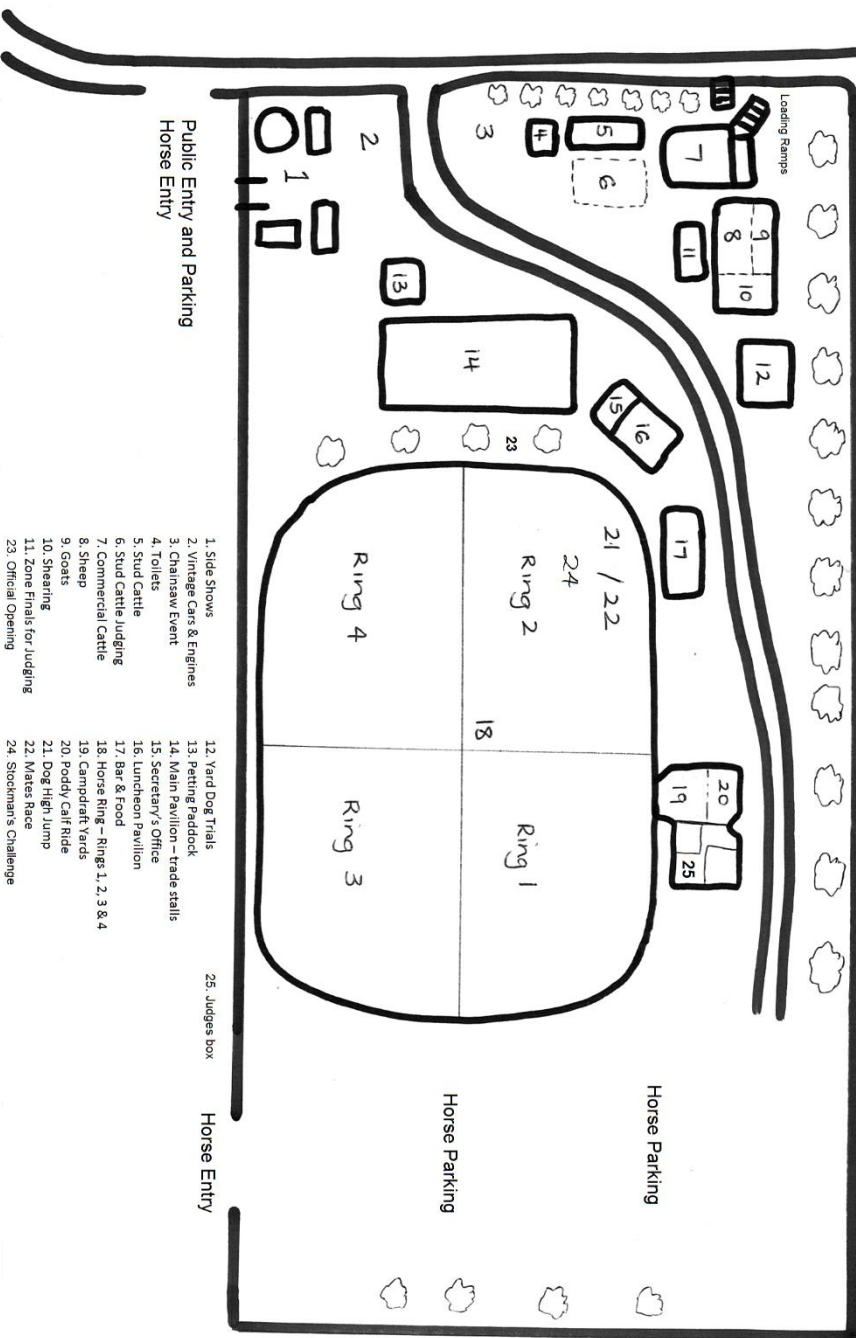

Each competitor in the oral section is allowed 3 minutes to line up the animals and explain the reasons for their selections. Appropriate clothing must be worn. Entry form and score sheets available on show day.

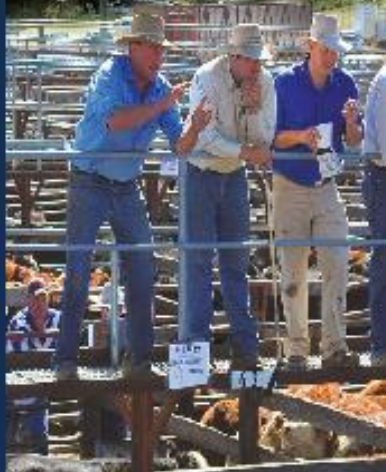

Annual CWA Cake – Lime & Buttermilk Cake

Recipe for lime and buttermilk cake – **must be used.**

Ingredients:

250g butter, softened
220g (1cup) caster sugar
1tbsp finely grated lime zest
3 eggs, separated
300g (2cups) self-raising flour
250ml (1cup) buttermilk
1-2tbsp lime juice



Method

Preheat oven to moderate (180C). Grease a 20cm (8in) round cake tin and line base with baking paper.

Cream butter, sugar and lime zest in a small mixing bowl until pale and creamy. Add and beat in egg yolks one at a time until combined. Transfer to a large mixing bowl.

Stir in half of the sifted flour, half of the buttermilk and half of the lime juice, then stir in the balance of the sifted flour, buttermilk and lime juice.

Whisk egg whites until soft peaks form. Fold in about half of the whites into mixture then fold in remainder - it will mix in better. Spread into the prepared tin.

Bake for about one hour or until cooked. Stand for 10 minutes before turning out.

Ice on top only.
