Figurative Artist Peggy Kroll Roberts

Award winning artist, Peggy Kroll Roberts, was trained at Arizona State University and the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California. Peggy worked as a fashion and advertising illustrator before making the transition to fine art. Using intense color and value to accentuate her subject, she moved into fine art with a bold palette, a love for small paintings and a very loose style that achieves a lot with a few very energetic strokes. She prefers to suggest reality rather than render it.

Inspired by her children, she paints beach scenes and other aspects of their lives. She also breaks away from the conventional still life by painting scenes of the occasional cup of coffee or slab of butter. Peggy's work gives us a new appreciation of our own daily life.

Peggy currently teaches still life and figure workshops with Plein Air Liaison, PAL.atelier in California as well as several other locations across the country and abroad. She is known for her lovely beach scenes, depiction of children and all aspects of daily life.

LAGUNA PLEIN AIR

The Laguna Plein Air Painters Association (LPAPA) is a nonprofit art organization based in Laguna Beach with nearly 500 artist members from California to Florida, Alaska to Hawaii, plus members in seven foreign countries. LPAPA's mission is dedicated to painting the landscape, preserving the plein air heritage of Laguna Beach, and inspiring the next generation of artists. Each year the Laguna Plein Air Painters Association transforms Laguna Beach, the famous seaside community and historic artist colony, into an outdoor painting studio with the West Coast's most prestigious plein air art event, the Laguna Beach Plein Air Painting Invitational. This event showcases the nation's top plein air landscape painters who compete for prestigious prizes and participate in a 9day plein air painting celebration that includes public paint-outs, painting demonstrations, Plein Talk conversations, and educational events and activities. The artists will be available on Sunday's Laguna Plein Air Art Show, a full day of art, live painting demonstrations and mingling with the artists. Free entrance to the public on Sunday October 15th, this is the one and only full day to see some of the best plein air art work in the country



Oil Painter—Jason Situ—SEPTEMBER GUEST ARTIST



Jason Situ was our Guest Artist for September. With remarkable talent he completed a landscape filled with light in just 35 minutes.

Some of his painting tips include...

Tone the canvas...He uses pale orange and rubs it into the canvas well ...Top of sky goes from cool to warm as it descends towards the horizon . ..Adds muted viridian at

the top of the sky. ... Make the viewer sense the change of temperature in both the sky and foreground.... Uses a pallet knife when he wants a more intense color laid in.... "An artist doesn't need to catch every detail..." You put in what both you (the artist) and the painting need." ... Use your memory and create something interesting.... WATCH nature. For example, check out a sunset day after day and see how it changes.



CHRIS SULLIVAN—WATERCOLOR WORKSHOP

Bubbly and talented Chris Sullivan presented a full day workshop in our Studio for interested watercolorists. Entitled 'Pouring Paint', she demonstrated how 3-6 'thumbnails' drawn in advance of any painting will help your composition resolve itself. These each become simplistic value studies. Used to also provide the necessary information of 'what areas' will remain white paper. "Value does the work and color gets the (undeserved) credit." She reinforced the idea of a focal point where the darkest dark meets up with the lightest light. Pouring the paint as opposed to painting with a brush allows the paint to run over the paper and to mix with unexpected results. Chris then may turn the paper over and over to see if an image other than her original intention comes to her mind. The concept of being 'out of control' is used to free up the artist from their usual method of approaching a painting.
