Harvey LeRoy Schuette, 91, of Pigeon, Michigan, passed away on Friday, August 18, 2023. Harvey was born in Huron County on April 4, 1932 to the late Arnold Schuette Sr. and Amanda (Wurst) Schuette. He graduated from Pigeon High
School, the class of 1950. Harvey was united in marriage to Doris Jean Siewert on February 13, 1960 at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church-Berne. They celebrated their sixty-third anniversary this year. Harvey spent two years in the Army as a drill sergeant, and was honorably discharged in 1954. After the Army, Harvey worked as a carpenter at the Pigeon Lumber Yard, a trade he practiced and excelled at for many years. His heart and soul were put into every project, task, and job he did. He coached softball and Little League Baseball. He loved bowling, gardening, working on crewel embroidery, and simply cheering for the University of Michigan in any sport they played.
